The London Times has voiced the feelings of the Empire when it says that the Allies are "firmly and irrevocably resolved not to stay, their hands until German militarism is crushed." The British peoples are in this war to the finish, to destroy the menace of two decades and make its reedudescence impossible. The division of territory that will come at the end of the struggle is only a secondary matter compared with the main result that must be achieved. A hard and binding agreement has to be reached to put an end to the insane competition in armaments that has been eating away the hearts of so many countries. If Germany as a nation has to be humbled to attain this end the humiliation is of her own making. No nation continually threaten others, more powerful than herself, without ultimately having to pay the penalty.
