NEUTRALITY WILL NOT GAIN ITALY REWARDS

Russian Authority Says Now Is Time to Take Trent and Trieste.

Rome, Sept. 24 .- The Giornale d'Italia quotes the Petrograd newspaper Birgewja Wiedomos as saying that it reflects the view of the Russian government in declaring that Italy must take Trent and Trieste now, with her own arms, or never, for if the Triple Entente is victorious it is not probable that they will give Italy those provinces as a reward for neutrality. Armed intervention by Italy, the Russian newspaper is quoted as saying, would be most useful now to assist Russia against Austria and Germany.
