However it will be decided it is certainly in bad taste for such an one to make the attempt. It does not appear a genuine transaction on his part. British citizenship is too honorable a thing to be given away lightly. Only the men who appreciate its value and are ready to defend it should be admitted. No doubt there are many in the hostile camp that prefer British laws, but this is a poor time to change. Let them show their loyalty first and they may be admitted later. It will not do to join the British just to prevent suspicion. It will be much better to wait till the war is over.


