### BUSINESS MEN'S EXCURSION FROM EAST

After negotiating with the G. T. P. for nearly a year, the Edmonton Board of Trade has been advised that the company is now in a position to handle the proposed trip to Fort George and Prince Rupert and return, which it had been expected it would have been practicable to arrange to take place about midsummer to inaugurate the opening of the through service on the G. T. P. to the coast. The long delay and altered business conditions have materially affected the plans of many of those who were formerly anxious to go, and a new canvass of those likely to be interested is being made by a committee of the board of trade. The committee has the matter in hand, and it is expected that those interested can be advised definitely during the present week.

## PASSING EVENTS

Mr. Asquith, speaking at Edinburgh, at a recruiting meeting on September 18th, said one of the roots of the present war was the grave and serious miscalculation regarding the British Empire that German culture and German spirit led Emperor William and the German people into. The Germans were under the mistaken belief that the British colonies wanted to cut connection with the Mother Country, and that India was in revolt. "What a fantastic dream and what a rude awakening," exclaimed the premier. As it has been proved that Germany by her own deliberate act made war, it is in the interest not only of the British Empire, but of civilization, that the arrogant claim of a single power to dominate the destinies and development of Europe should be resisted.

The report of Sir Maurice de Bunsen, late British ambassador to Vienna, just published in the form of a white paper by the foreign office in London, shows that Austria and Russia had about reached an agreement on the Austro-Serbian dispute when their conversations were cut short by the transfer of the dispute to the more dangerous ground of a direct conflict between Germany and Russia. Austria had practically consented to submit to mediation the points in the note to Serbia which seemed incompatible with the maintenance of Serbian independence, when Germany intervened on July 31 by means of her double ultimatum to St. Petersburg and Paris. These ultimatums were of a kind to which only one reply was possible and Germany declared war on Russia, August 1, and on France, August 3. A few days' delay might, in all probability, have saved Europe from one of the greatest calamities in history.

All accounts received in Paris agree that the famous Prussian Guard Corps, the elite of the empire and the especial pride of the German Emperor, were practically blotted out from the battles which have been waged along the Meuse, Marne and Aisne rivers.

Roumania, according to Rome despatches, has been greatly impressed by the Russian victories in Austria, and has practically decided to join the Allies. She has also been tempted by an offer of

Transylvania, which runs south and west of Roumania, and is separated from that country by the Carpathian mountains. The Czar recently declared that Russia would not seize any territory as a result of the war, but that there would be readjustments of the map according to racial affiliations. Transylvania, which is an integral part of Hungary, has a population of 2,500,000, of whom 2,400,000 are Roumanians.

Among those wounded in the battles now going on in France was Prince Friedrich Karl of Hesse, brother-in-law of the Kaiser.

Lord Kitchener in a vigorous speech in the House of Lords on September 17 again urged the necessity of developing armed forces to carry on and bring the mighty conflict to a successful conclusion. There were already in France, he said, rather more than six divisions of British troops and cavalry, which were being maintained at their full strength. Further, regular divisions and additional cavalry were being organized from units drawn from overseas garrisons, which were now being occupied by territorials and volunteers. A division of territorials already had left for Egypt, a brigade had gone to Malta, and a garrison force to Gibraltar. Referring to the two new armies, Lord Kitchener said that new divisions were now being called at the training quarters. The third army was being formed on the new camping ground and the fourth army was being created. Meantime, Indian divisions were on their way.

Swiss military officers are alleged to be in possession of German official documents which show that the Kaiser planned to violate Swiss territory, just as he did Belgium. The intended movement through Switzerland, which would have put the Germans on the other side of the fortress at Belfort, was made impossible by the speedy Swiss mobilization, which was effected in less than two days.

Charged with being a spy, the well known Russian, General Baron Nicholas Kaubars, is reported to have been executed at Odessa. Kaubars fought in the Russo-Japanese war. At Mukden he commanded the Third army, whose defeat by General Nogi threatened the envelopment of the Russian forces, and decided the outcome of the battle.

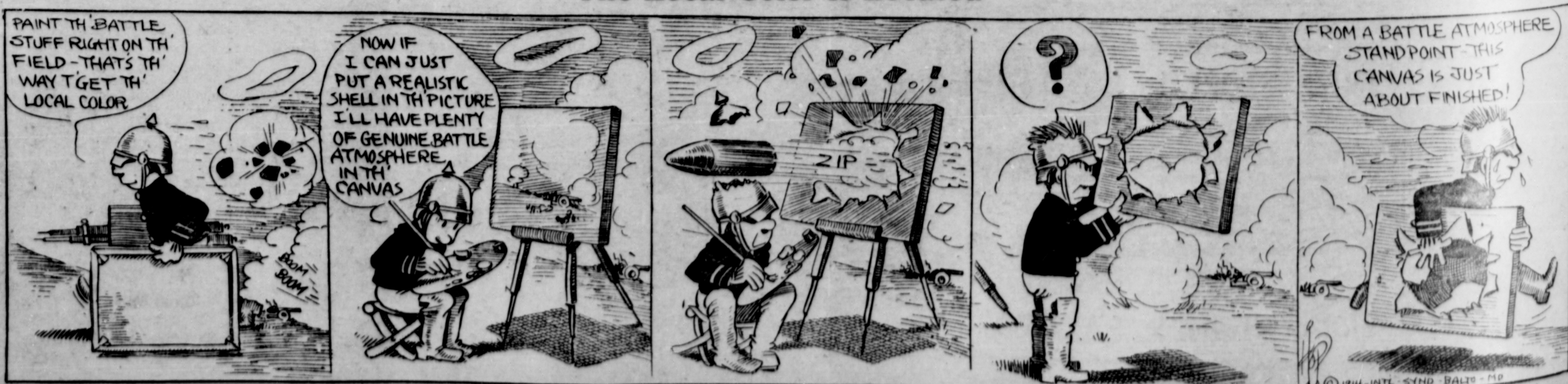
