EMPEROR'S OPINIONS

German Ruler's Comments on French Army Interesting in View of War Developments.

An extract from a recent issue of the Echo, one of the newspapers of Paris, gives an interesting account of a conversation in which Emperor Wilhelm of Germany expressed his opinion of the French army. It follows:

"In June, 1897, the nephew of the Marquis of Noailles, then lieutenant of dragoons, came to pay a visit to his uncle, who was our ambassador at Berlin.

"He was invited to dinner by some German officers and the Emperor, falling in with the party unexpectedly, took his place among the guests. He conversed familiarly with the lieutenant and spoke to him of the French army in these terms, which lend a lively interest to the present circumstances:

"You have in your country a very fine army; I have been able to appreciate that when I have been in France.

"Your infantry is admirable. I think, nevertheless, mine is not inferior. I cannot, unfortunately, say as much for my artillery. As for material, as well as teams, French artillery has a superiority over German artillery, but I do not despair of remedying this inferiority.

"On the other hand, my cavalry, as you have been able to judge, is much better than yours, notwithstanding you have had a man whose counsels, if they had been followed, would have given you the first cavalry in the world."

"This was General de Galliffet, whose papa and grandpapa, like himself, had always admired and applied theories.

"Thus seventeen years have elapsed since we possessed these marvellous engines which are making such ravages in the German ranks. William had already recognized the superiority of French artillery. And, as for the superiority of his cavalry, he ought to be now strongly edified on this subject."
