

EXEMPIONS ARE REVOKED BY GERMANS

Petrograd, Oct. 17 .- The German losses have forced the German government to revoke all exemptions to military service, says a statement given out by the official press agency.

"The German army being short of equipment an order has been issued to bury the dead soldiers without uniforms and shoes.

"Agents of the committee of union and progress continue to excite public opinion in Constantinople by giving out news of the war at patriotic meetings."
