ATTEMPT ON PRESIDENT.

German Aviator Endeavors to Drop Bomb on Tent of French President—Brought Down. London, Oct. 19.—The Paris correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph Company in a dispatch says: "Now that the headquarters of the French staff has been changed, it has become possible to announce that when President Poincare visited General Joffre a German aviator dropped a bomb into the town, doing no damage."

The news of the approaching visit of President Poincare had been communicated to the enemy by a spy. One of their best pilots was sent out with a bomb, which he was ordered to drop on the quarters occupied by the President and General Joffre. A French aviator named Framnz immediately pursued and brought down the raider. Framnz was rewarded by President Poincare, who pinned the cross of the Legion of Honor on the aviator's tunic."

TRAITOR IF NOT SOLDIER.

London, Oct. 20.—The Belgian government before removing to France, says a dispatch from The Hague to the Exchange Telegraph Company, ordered all male citizens between the ages of 18 and 45 to enter the army within two days or be treated as traitors.

GERMAN WIFE RECEIVES HEARTLESS OFFICIAL NOTE

Paris, Oct. 19.—The following is an extract from a letter sent by a German soldier to his wife: "Events are happening very differently from what we were led to expect. The French are courageous and fight admirably. Our fatigue is terrible. I am famished and will allow myself to be taken prisoner at the first opportunity."

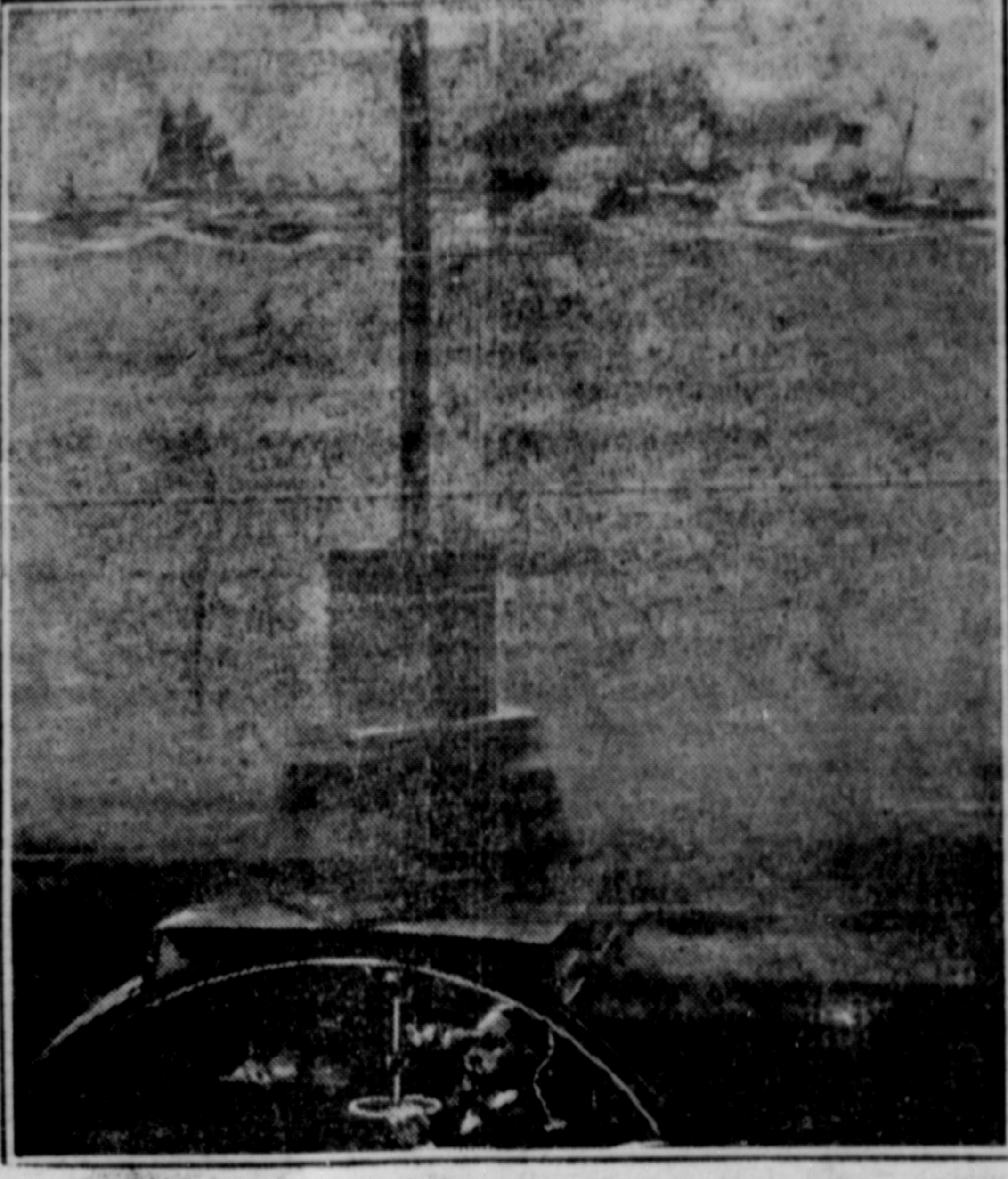
The letter was forwarded to the woman with the inhuman official note: "The signatory of this letter has been shot."

CAPSIZED BOAT MAY TELL TALE

Recent happenings would point to a serious accident having happened to someone in the neighboring waters. Yesterday afternoon Mr. H. Johnson, of Seal Cove, picked up a twelve-foot boat, with an Evenrude engine, upset in the water beyond the cold storage plant. The indications were that the engine was freshly in use.

It is possible that this story may be connected with that yesterday reported by The News, when cries of distress were heard on the harbor on Saturday evening. Another solution of the mystery is that somebody may have attempted crossing the rapids beyond Shawatlans during a rush of tide. A boat of that kind would be almost sure to swamp. Up to the present it has been impossible to locate either the identity of the boat or to find if anyone is missing, although everything points in that direction.

ROYAL PROCLAMATION TO GOVERN CORRESPONDENCE

London, Oct. 19.—A royal proclamation just issued forbids the transit, which is subject to the censor's scrutiny, of any letter or written message to any person of any nationality carrying on business in the enemy's country. It is further ruled that any person landing or embarking in the United Kingdom must declare whether he is carrying any letter or message. Officers are empowered to search the luggage of a subject and seize any letter if they are doubtful as to the character and submit the same to the military censor.
