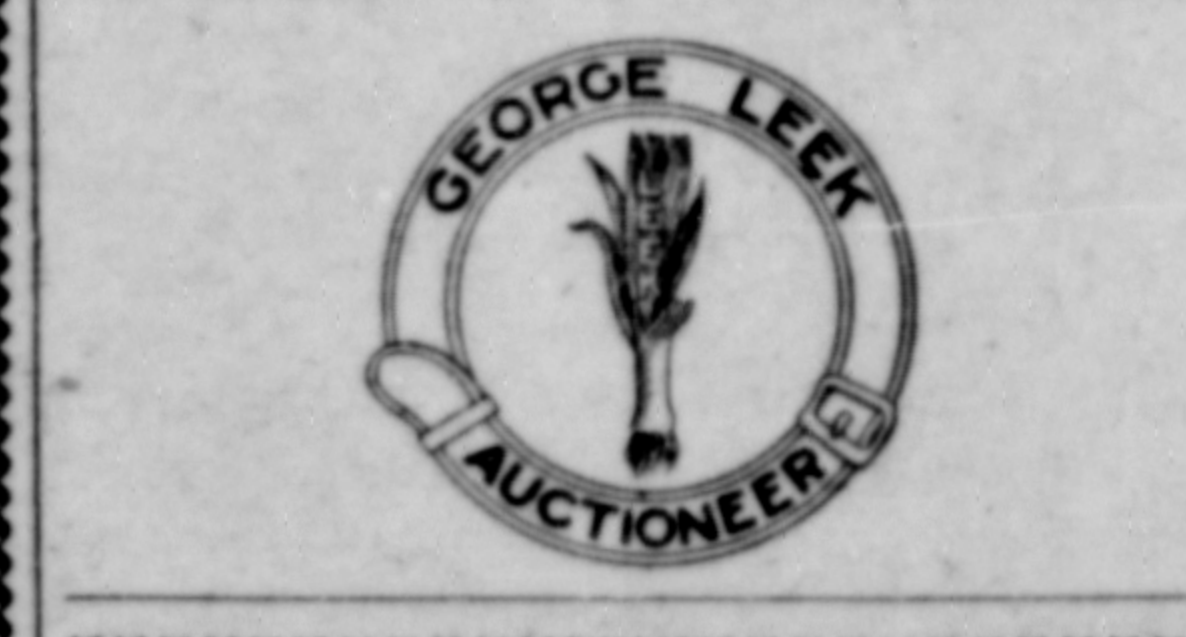
A large number of brooms and a can of oil are at the City Hall ready for the torch light procession tonight. The oil was donated by the Imperial Oil Company.

**MAY GO TO EGYPT.**  
Report in Letter That Part of the Canadian Contingent Will Guard Suez Canal.

Montreal, Nov. 5.—A Berlin dispatch a few days ago contained a statement that Canadian troops were on patrol duty at the Suez Canal. According to a local newspaper, a letter received by a Montreal man from his brother, a lieutenant in the 14th Battalion, dated Salisbury, October 14, the day the Canadian force is reported to have reached Plymouth, said a portion of the Canadian troops would probably go to Egypt.

"We expect to leave for Egypt in a few days to guard the Suez Canal, and it is said that 14,000 of the Canadian troops will be sent over."

**SHIP FROM GERMANY REACHES N. Y. SAFELY**

New York, Nov. 5.—The Swedish steamer Sagoland has reached New York from Emden, Germany, with the distinction of being the first vessel to make a voyage from Germany to New York since Germany went to war.  
The Sagoland left Emden in charge of a skilled pilot, who picked his way carefully through the mines in the North Sea. She took a course north of Scotland.

**POVERTY IS INCREASED BY ECONOMIES OF RICH**  
London, Nov. 5.—"The economy being practiced by the English women at present is causing lack of work in certain branches of trade. At a meeting of relatively unemployed people here it was stated that one-third of the 66,000 dressmakers in London are on short time because even the well-to-do are buying cheap ready-made clothing.
