"SPARTACUS."

"Spartacus," George Kleine's latest masterpiece in animated photography, photodramatically and delectably tells of historic, tragic and romantic events attendant upon the revolt of the gladiators against Roman domain. It will be the attraction at the Westholme Theatre for two nights commencing Wednesday, November 11th.

The interesting historical occurrences on which this motion picture classic is built are seasoned with a flavor of romanticism that cannot fail to suit the taste of the most fastidious devotees of the photodrama. It deals charmingly with the unfaltering love of Spartacus, gladiator and Thracian prince, for the daughter of the Roman consul, Crassus, the marvelous virility of the erstwhile barbaric potentate having fascinated and enamored her. His overpowering love for her proved no greater than that of the woman. It eventuates in her successful efforts to save him from a terrible death in the arena—that of being torn to pieces by lions. The perishing in his stead of a jealous rival who had conspired to bring Spartacus to the tragic death that was meted out to him is an episode both dramatic and sensational that holds the spectators spellbound, but carries with it no feeling of repulsion—the horror of the arena being lost in the exultation of the spectators that Spartacus was saved and restored to the arms of his devoted sweetheart.

Gladiatorial combats in the presence of morbid thousands, who are portrayed enthusing over the agonized suffering and martyric deaths of the Titans of the short sword and shield, keep the interest of the spectators at a feverish pitch. Shambles resultant from the sanguinary clashes between the Romans and the arena fighters and the perilous escape of the gladiators from their rendezvous when hemmed in by the Romans are so realistically

and vividly visualized on the screen as to thrill all the beholders. This photodrama, as have been all its predecessors presented by George Kleine and which it is declared to outrank as an absorbingly interesting attraction, was produced by a famous Italian company. Its masters of pantomime and expression such as only the Italian school creates delineate this gripping and thrilling narrative with its aura of fighting and romance in such a dramatically powerful manner that at times it is with difficulty that the illusion of the camera is maintained.

THREE MILLION SUFFER HUNGER
 Ambassador Page Cables Appeal to the People of the United States.

New York, Nov. 2.—Three million women and children in Belgium now are suffering actual hunger, according to a cablegram from Walter Hines Page, received here today by Norman Hapgood of the committee of mercy.

"I hope you are in a position to buy and ship immediately a boat-load of food to the American consul at Rotterdam under a neutral flag," reads the cablegram. "He is the local agent of the international commission of relief, to whom consignments are shipped. I hope the committee of mercy will do our country the honor to send a cargo of food quickly to the worst stricken three million women and children in the whole world, who are now suffering actual hunger. Cable answer."

Ambassador Page calls attention, in his message, to the fact that England had forbidden the export of foodstuffs and all must come from America.

"This does not call for the sending of money to England," reads the message.
 "No food can be bought anywhere in Europe."
