ALBERT OF BELGIUM EVERY INCH A KING

"My skin is of no more value to my country than is yours. My place is on the fighting line."

Thus spoke Albert, King of the Belgians, a king for the moment without a country, according to the Germans, but a king who bids fair to write his name in glorious letters in the world's history.

He spoke to the members of his personal staff, who urged him to leave the front, where he was actually under the German fire. A correspondent who saw him at the moment wrote:

"He was wet to the skin from the rain that had been falling for hours. His uniform was covered with eaked clay."

Not precisely the picture of a king on the battlefield as the great painters of the past have limned them, but one eminently stirring, wholly honorable, magnificently characteristic of a monarch and a people who have won the outspoken admiration and applause even of those they are fighting—a fact unparalleled in the history of war.

In a sense Albert of Belgium is an accidental king. His father and elder brother stood betwixt him and the throne which Leopold of Paris coulissee fame occupied, but did not adorn. But King Leopold outlived alike the heir-apparent and the heir-presumptive, and on his death Albert, then 34 years old, succeeded to the throne.

He brought to it democratic convictions and some experience of democratic institutions, for he

Most Vulnerable Point.

The most vulnerable point in the purchase of German ships during the war is that the sale is not in any way conditional. The sale must be bona fide, absolute and unconditional to be recognizable, and there is some doubt whether it would hold water even then. The libel against a German vessel is thus a menace to such sales as well as being of itself a danger to the present German shipowners. The United States government, in the event that Congress ratifies the President's policy in favor of a government purchase of such vessels, would have to give serious consideration to this situation.

is a material consideration. Skelton crews must be kept on board and reports to Washington from time to time have indicated that some of the German vessels have been kept in such a state of preparedness that they have even had steam up ready for departure. The vigilance of the British warships, however, has prevented this in practically every instance.

Only seven German merchant vessels have thus far been transferred to American registry and the claim of the owners in each of these cases is that they have always been owned by Americans.

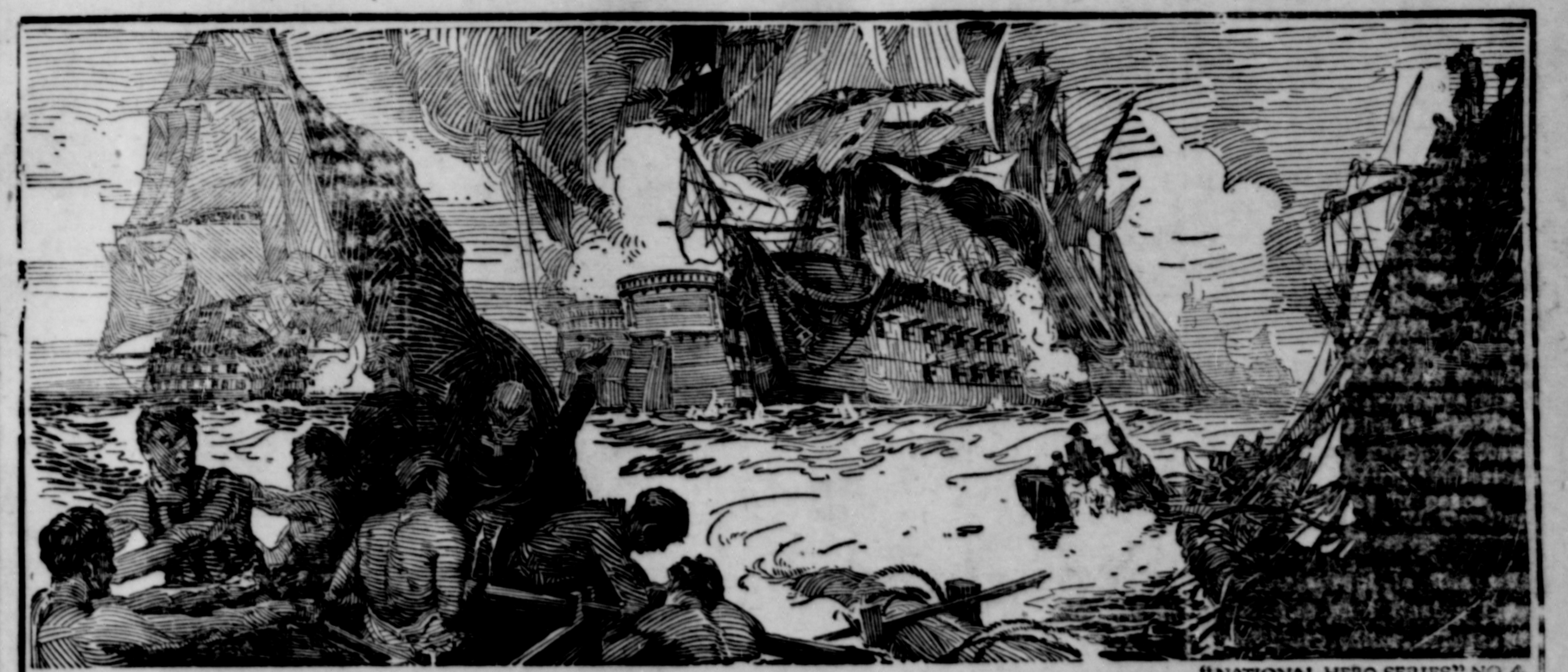
