FINAL COUNT OVER BOXING IN THE SOUTH

Professional Twenty-Round Game Will Be Barred in California in the Future.

San Francisco, Nov. 6.—It is a foregone conclusion that the final count has been made over the boxing game in California and the professional twenty-round sport declared officially out. There seemed to be a lingering, faint-hearted hope well into Wednesday night that later returns would prove favorable, but the latest returns indicate a stronger majority in favor of the anti-fight measure. Men who have been connected with the game from a standpoint of promoting are admitting that boxing has been killed.

Under the new law any boxer who has ever been paid for his services is barred as an amateur. This means that an entirely new crop would have to be developed. The law also prohibits anything more than trophies worth \$35 and that in itself would be a dash of cold water to the boxers.

THE BELGIAN RELIEF FUND.

Editor, The Daily News.

Sir,—At the present time, several patriotic local organizations are engaged in the good work of collecting funds for the Belgian Relief Fund. These efforts will, no doubt, result in the raising of a considerable sum for this charitable object. With regard to the disposal of the amount collected, this would I presume in the ordinary course take the form of a cash contribution to the central fund of the Belgian Relief Committee, forming one of many similar ones from other points, and thus losing if not in its identity, at least to a certain extent its individuality.

I venture to submit the following suggestion to those handling this good work for consideration: That instead of making cash contributions, they make the contribution from Prince Rupert, one of food products, preferably in the shape of either canned salmon from the Skeena River canneries, or of halibut shipped in cold storage.

We are all interested at the present time in making the fish products of the northern waters of British Columbia known to the Old World. A gift of this description would not only be acceptable to the heroic population of Belgium, and be remembered, but would also identify Prince Rupert as a center for fish products of quality unexcelled, especially interesting to the old country owing to the havoc that has been played with the fishing industry of the North Sea by mines at the present time.

A subscription plan of this description should obtain the hearty support of all interested in this industry, owing to the world-wide publicity that would surely be obtained.

The entry of food products for the Belgian relief is, according to latest advices, allowed by the combatants in the present war, so there would probably be no difficulty in making the necessary arrangements.

WILL DEMAND 2,000,000 MEN FOR KITCHENER

London, Nov. 6.—Every word from the front, official and private, tells of the unparalleled fury of the German onslaughts on the British and French lines last week-end, attacks so desperate that German officers threatened to fire upon any troop which hung back. It is from German, not British bullets, that our latest prisoners are suffering. The enemy's efforts have slackened for the moment, but it is futile to imagine that they are ended in Northern France and Belgium.

The Daily Mail correspondent declares the German right has been smashed like a fallen wine glass. Their retreat from Northern Belgium was like a rout; even wounded comrades being left behind. Other reports, however, show that the Germans are preparing for a prolonged resistance around Brussels, which they may hope to tempt the Allies to bombard, and on the historic field of Waterloo, which has become a mass of trenches. Ever given to the theatrical, the Kaiser may hope to conjure up the figure of Blucher, "that man who, in Napoleon's day, won the battle of Waterloo for the traitorous English."

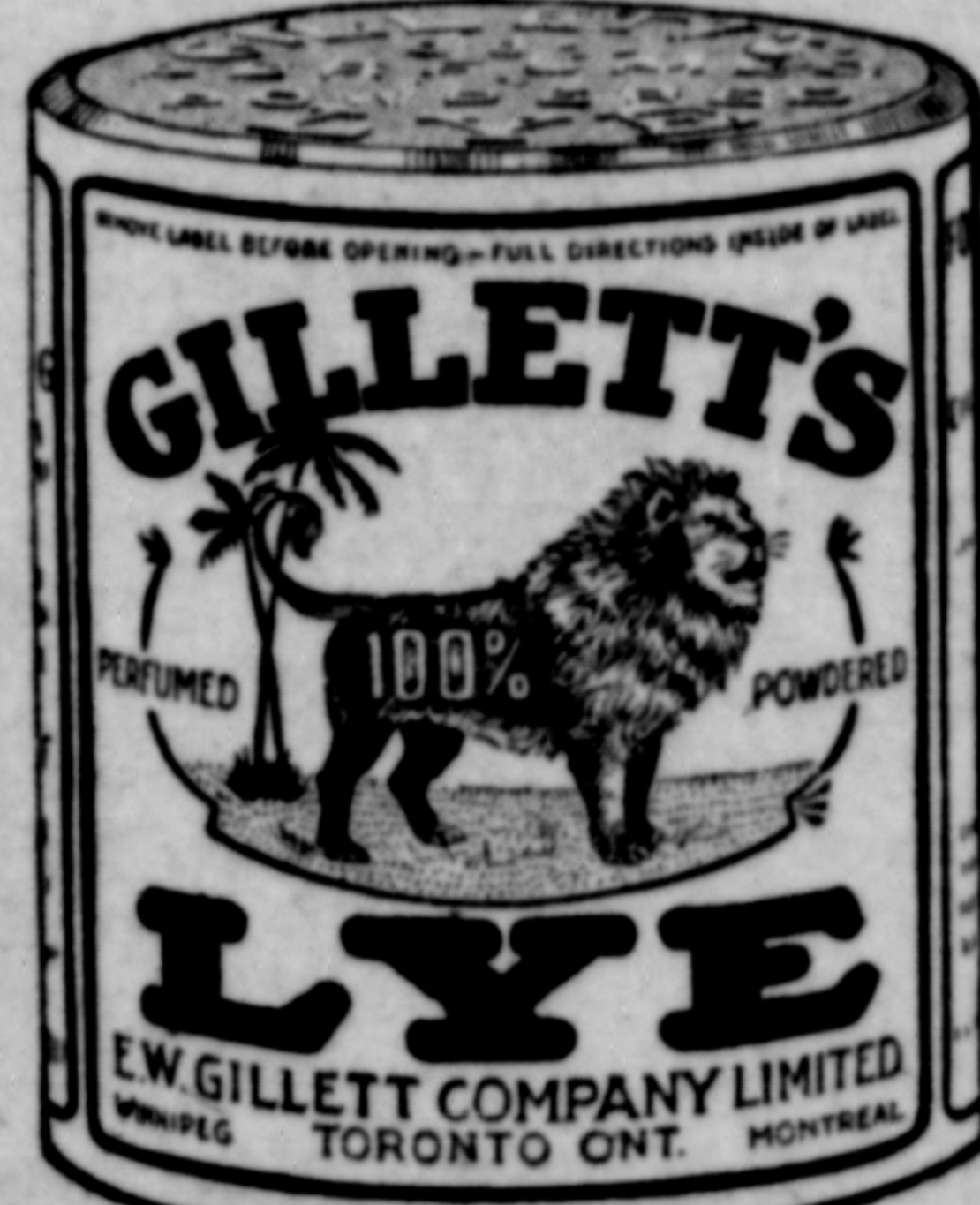
The Times, in an editorial, warns the English public against the delusion that the end of the war is within a measurable distance. It will take far more crushing blows, it says, before the 65,000,000 high-spirited Germans, their immense resources of men and materials, admit defeat. When Parliament meets, next week, demands are likely to come from influential quarters for some form of compulsion which will give Kitchener two million trained men by next March—Vancouver Province.
