IN A NASTY SITUATION.

German Paper Suspends for Speaking Frankly of Germany's Plight.

Amsterdam, Nov. 21.—The pan-Germanist Post has been suspended for a violent article attacking the Austrians for incapacity in the field. It is owing to them, it asserted, that the entire plan of the campaign would have to be changed, that Craew must now be abandoned and that both army leaders and diplomats find themselves in a very nasty situation. The paper proceeded to declare that much of the blame for all this unsatisfactory state of affairs must be laid at the door of the Imperial Chancellor, whose blundering policy had dragged Germany into a war in which, now, there was no telling how she would emerge.

SALARIES REDUCED.

Vancouver City Council has decided to reduce city salaries as follows:

Salaries of \$300 or over per month, 30 per cent; from \$200 to \$299 per month, 25 per cent; from \$100 to \$199 per month, 20 per cent; from \$75 to \$99 per month, 15 per cent; below \$75 a month, 10 per cent.

The reduction will not apply to anyone on half-time or relief work. The monthly saving is estimated at \$11,000 to \$12,000.

EMPRESS AND DAUGHTERS WORK HARD AS NURSES

Czarina and Duchesses Don Uniforms and Undertake Heavy Routine of Hospital.

Petrograd, Nov. 15.—(Correspondence to the Associated Press.)—Almost in the shadow of the Imperial Palace in Tsarko-Selo, the winter home of Emperor Nicholas, there is a low building half hidden behind villas which is perhaps the most remarkable hospital improvised during the present war. The hospital is supported by funds at the disposition of the minister of the Imperial court. At the special request of the Empress, a part of the building has been set aside as the court hospital, where the Empress and her two eldest daughters, the Grand Duchess Olga and Tatiana, work among the other Red Cross nurses from 10 o'clock every morning until late in the afternoon.

Rank Set Aside.

There is nothing either in the nature of their work or in the appearance of their gray gingham uniforms and white nun-like hoods to distinguish them from the others. Their rank is not made the excuse for any escape nor any respite from any hardships from the daily routine. At all the most difficult operations, her Majesty acts as head nurse, handing the operating surgeon his instruments while the two grand duchesses pass the necessary cloths and bandages. The effect of this imperial presence on the simple peasant mind cannot be fully appreciated without understanding the religious awe which the peasant feels toward the Imperial family.

Pleases Wounded.

This semi-religious exaltation of the wounded soldiers, has, according to the surgeons in the hospitals, noticeably hastened their return to health. Once a week the Emperor visits the two youngest daughters Marie and Anastasia. During these visits it is his custom to make the entire rounds of the 121 beds for privates and 29 for officers and to question the men as to how they received their wounds.

All the hospitals in Tsarko-Selo and Pavlosk are under the patronage of the Empress and the wounded are conveyed from the hospital trains in the automobiles of the Imperial garage.

SWITZERLAND DENIES SLANDEROUS STORY

Berne, Switzerland, via Paris, Nov. 21.—Repeated statements appearing in the Italian press that Switzerland has entered into a secret convention with Austria and Germany, binding herself to support with her army an invasion of north Italy and to permit an Austro-German force to pass through Switzerland in the event of Italy abandoning her neutrality in favor of the Triple Entente, has brought forth a strong protest from the Swiss government. The existence of any such convention is denied and it is declared that the reports are an insult to Switzerland and her army.

CANADA SUGGESTS THREE-DOMINION FLEET ON PACIFIC

May Unite With Australia and New Zealand in Joint Naval Defence Scheme.

London, Nov. 21.—The Australian correspondent of The Morning Post says that the government has decided to give a public welcome to the officers and men of the Sydney, which ran the Emden to her death.

The correspondent also hints at a probable joint scheme of naval defence in the Pacific between Australia and New Zealand, and mentions that the reports of the proposed initiation on the part of the Canadian government of United Action with Australia and New Zealand has caused the liveliest satisfaction and revived interest in the possibility of an early realization of a Pacific fleet of the three dominions.

In a telegram to the governor of New Zealand, Rt. Hon. Andrew Fisher expressed the hope that the time is not far distant when the sister dominions washed by the Pacific Ocean will closely share with Australia the glories of a Pacific sea force.

Shot Rudder Away.

London, Nov. 21.—A dispatch from Melbourne, Australia, to Reuter's Telegram Company contains part of the report which Captain John Glossop, of the Australian cruiser Sydney, made regarding the fight in which the German cruiser Emden was destroyed. It says:

"The Emden's firing soon failed when the Sydney began to hit the mark. The Emden's rudder was destroyed early in the fight, her speed suffering greatly in consequence.

"Her next loss was the number one funnel, then the foremast, and this was followed by the number two funnel. Finally the number three funnel fell."
