

DUMDUM BULLETS USED BY ENEMY

War Office Denies That British Troops Use Soft Nosed Bullets but Accuse Enemy.

London, Nov. 17 .- The War Of. fice issued tonight a statement denying German allegations that | } the British troops have used dumdum or soft nosed bullets, but maintaining that these missles have been used by the Germans.

The statement describes the British and German service ammunition as very similar, the bullets being pointed with steel and the envelope coated with supronickel, covering the core except at the base and conforming with the provisions of The Hague Convention.

In the opinion of Sir Victor Horsley, a widely known surgeon, for the reason that the "long solid point consisting almost entirely of a hard nickel sheath, precludes as far as possible any tendency toward deformation of shape, while the strength of the sheath prevents the bullet breaking up into fragments except in very exceptional circumstances." Concluding, the statement says: There is, however, clear evidence that Germany has not confined herself solely to the use of this unobjectionable ammunition.
