Belgian Premier and Minister of War Made Remarkable Address in Belgian Chamber of Deputies.

BRITAIN INVESTIGATES ITS GOLD RESERVE

Suspicion That Some Metal Is Going to the Enemy-Stock Exchange Loans.

London, Nov. 28 .- Gold is being hoarded in England at such a rate as to cause much discussion. Amsterdam, Nov. 30 .- The Vas About 30,000,000 pounds sterling Dias Agency has been authorized (\$150,000,000) has been received to publish a speech of Baron in gold by England from other Charles de Broqueville, Belgian countries in the last three months. Moreover, treasury notes have been put into circulation to the amount of 30,250,000 pounds, in addition to 5,000,000 pounds in Bank of England notes. Nevertheless, the increase in gold holdings of the Bank of England has amounted to no more than the gold actually received from abroad. This proves conclusively, it is said, that there is general hoarding of gold.

The Mail suggests that some of this gold is being sent to Germany by means of secret agents, women as well as men, and it demands that a strict examination be made of all tourists to see that they are not assisting Germany to build up a large gold supply at the expense of England's gold holdings.
