Drunkunless the murderer were absolutely incapable of forming an intent. Whether the murderer of Taylor was in this condition or not, the jury could judge from the position of the fatal wounds.

The jury retired at 3:50 p. m. and returned at 4:50 to ask for further definitions of "murder" and "manslaughter." His Lordship gave this information, and fifteen minutes later the jury brought in the verdict of guilty.


