While a saving was made in the treasurer's department of some \$43, it must be remembered that last year some extra expenses were entailed on account of the disgraceful condition in which the public accounts were found. This brings us to the statement

of the chairman of finance, that 'We have completely adjusted all the public accounts and have completed the most perfect audit that has ever been given to the city." Let me point out that prior to last year both the present mayor and the present chairman of finance were in office, and what was the state of the public accounts then? Nothing short of shocking. Yet what did the two gentlemen know of the situation or what action did they take to remedy the condition? The echo answers, "Nothing." The truth again is that the present state of efficiency is due to the action taken by last year's council, though, after all, the main thing is, not who did it, but that it is

I only refer to it now because at the beginning of this year our friend the chairman of finance was one of those who bamboozled the city into pursuing a course of action by reason of which the city will be the loser of over a million dollars and his letter is evidently intended to persuade them to a continuance of that course.

This is a good time for the citizens to do some hard thinking because to a very considerable degree, in the measure of their wisdom, depends how smooth or how rough the road is going to be.


