WILL INCREASE PAY

Employees at Granby smelter have received a pleasing notice from the company, intimating that their wages will be increased by 5 per cent, commencing resumed operations recently to relieve the labor situation locally the men went to work at a reduction of 25 per cent. The Granby company has now seen its way clear and will allow an increase in wages, the men after January 1 receiving a reduction of but 20 per cent below the old scale.

There is also a probability that the Granby will shortly blow in two more furnaces at the smelter, increasing the number in operation from four to six. While the copper market has not maintainled its recent raise, it is understood that the plant can be more leconomically operated with an increased battery of furnaces, and this will be given a trial.
