WILSON TO DISCUSS ALASKA RY. LINE

President Will Receive J. P. Morgan for Conference With Secretary Lane.

Washington, Jan. 21.—J. Pierpont Morgan will have conferences tomorrow with President Wilson and Secretary Lane, of the Interior Department. The chief object of his coming is said to be to discuss Alaskan railway problems, with particular reference to the Copper River & Northwestern Railroad, which Mr. Morgan has offered to sell to the government for use as a part of the railway authorized by Congress last March to connect the Alaskan coast with the coal fields.

Has Held One Conference.

Under the law the President is authorized to select the route and decide whether the entire road shall be built, or whether any existing roads shall be purchased as links in the system.

The Alaskan engineering commission, which made surveys of all possible routes, including that covered by the Morgan road, already has held one conference with the President and is now completing its formal report. Mr. Morgan discussed the Alaskan situation with Secretary Lane several months ago and at the time offered to sell his line to the government.

Mr. Morgan on his arrival here tonight was asked whether he would discuss with the President questions in connection with the loan to the Russian government. He said he would not say in advance what matters he intended to discuss at the White House, but that he came to Washington primarily in connection with a meeting of the advisory council of the federal reserve system, of which he is a member.

Wilson Gets Protests.

Since the announcement that an American banking house was to finance a credit loan to Russia, there have been some letters to the White House expressing objection to such a course. There is no legal restriction either in domestic or international law against the floating of loans in the United States, except that the government itself is prohibited from lending financial aid.

Mr. and Mrs. Mitchell Murray Disappear Immediately After Their Marriage.

Seattle, Jan. 21.—Rose Ellis and Mitchell Murray, or rather Mr. and Mrs. Mitchell Murray, who led an irate father and a constable from Rainier, Ore., a merry chase last week prior to their marriage in Seattle, disappeared from this city yesterday. A. G. Brady, a merchant, of 1041 Third Avenue, who acted as best man when Rev. Carter Helm Jones performed the ceremony, said last night that he did not know where the young couple had gone, but expressed the opinion that they were merely seeking to enjoy their honeymoon in peace.

The couple eloped from Rainier. In Tacoma, where they were found by Thomas Ellis, the girl's father, charges were preferred against both, but the girl escaped to Seattle and here obtained, by pledging her jewelry, the necessary \$500 to secure the release of the young man on bond. He darted over to Seattle on Friday night and the wedding quickly followed.

The constable then returned to Rainier, and the father followed, according to Mr. Brady, but whether full and free forgiveness

has been obtained by the couple has not been learned.

Mr. Brady says he does not believe the charges against the couple will now be pressed.
