NELSON SEEKS ROYALTY ON NAME "BATTLING" Durable Dane Says Boxers Should Be Stopped From Using It.

New York, Feb. 2.—Batting Nelson is going to law to protect his name. The Durable Dane says he is sick and tired of all kinds of fighters hooking the name "Batting" on to themselves.

"Batting" is Nelson's real name, and he believes he has an exclusive right to it and that the other ring men who have appropriated it should be enjoined and either prevented from using it or pay a royalty on the "Nelson copyright."

One of his first acts this week will be to seek an injunction to prevent Dan Morgan from billing his heavyweight fighter Levinsky as "Batting" Levinsky. Nelson will go to court and ask that both Morgan and Levinsky be prevented from using the name unless a business arrangement is made with the Nelson forces.

POPULAR OLD-TIMER WILL LEAVE CITY

It will be heard with general regret that Mr. A. J. Morris is to leave Prince Rupert. The firm of Piercy, Morris & Co. has decided to operate entirely for the present from their office at Edmonton.

As a matter of fact, this firm has catered almost entirely in the past to the trade of the railway contractors and now that this class of business is about over they have decided to reduce expenses by operating from the Edmonton office. Of course this doesn't mean that they will cease to do business on the Coast and along the line. Indeed, the head office of the company will still be registered at Prince Rupert and should there be an increased demand for their particular lines they are ready at any time to return.

Mr. Morris is an old-timer in British Columbia, having come to Victoria from England while a very young man, and became associated with Mr. John Piercy, afterwards becoming a partner. During the Dawson boom days he represented the company in that district and made many trips over the northern trails.

When Prince Rupert was decided upon as the terminus of the G. T. P. Mr. Morris was the first to suggest to his firm that they move to Prince Rupert and take advantage of the good things in view. This was done and in 1908 the firm of Piercy, Morris & Co. was transferred to this city and took up their abode on Centre Street, where the center of business was then located. In 1910 they moved to their present site, where they secured a lease from G. T. P., which, by the way, has been recently canceled, and suits admirably the present plans.

Mr. Morris will leave this city with the highest esteem of all his associates, who will hope that his affairs will be so guided that he may yet return to our midst. Of course, he will not leave Prince Rupert for perhaps a couple of months, as this time is required to straighten out his affairs.

Acquitted of Arson Charge. Prince George B. C., Feb. 3.—Jacob Goodman was acquitted on a charge of arson by Judge Calder in the County Court here Saturday. The case arose out of the burning of a store at McBride on January 2. Goodman still faces charges of mischief in connection with the same incident.

Must Tell Their Ages. Chicago, Feb. 3.—Women voters of Chicago must tell their ages when they register tomorrow, according to a ruling today by County Judge Thomas G. Scully. They must answer the same questions, he ruled, that are required of men. Campaign managers said the ruling undoubtedly would keep many women away from registration.

TIME FOR PEACE HAS NOT YET COME

Renewed Talk of Ending Hostilities Gets No Encouragement From British Press.

London, Feb. 3.—The renewed peace talk gets no encouragement from the British press. The Times says:

"We mean to have real peace and we shall fight on until we get it. This will remain our attitude to the end. When Germany is ready to accept our terms, she knows where to say so. Until then, her suggestions of peace either are dishonest statements intended to curry favor with America or are indifferent to us."

The Daily Mail says: "Austria-Hungary may sue for an early peace and the Magyars may even proclaim their independence. It will make little difference. The Allies have but one goal, the destruction of that Prussian militarism which has driven all Germany into a course incompatible with the freedom of Europe. When the military and naval power of Germany is broken, it will be time enough for peace. Until then, the whinings of their dupes and accomplices are so much wasted breath."
