An interesting discussion has been going on for some time in the Federal Parliament about happenings in the Civil Service. Dr. Adam Shortt, the Chief Commissioner, reported that during the life of the present government 2,000 employees have been "fired" and 10,000 hired in the place of these. As the former were Liberals the inference is that two Liberals are as good as five Tories. Since 1911 there has been no development in Canada; so this increase cannot be put down to further development. The acme of Canada's development was contemporary with the defeat of the Laurier government. Why, then, increase the staff? It is also noted that the annual expenditure for gone up about 50 per cent since 1911. Canada apparently made a bad, bargain when she elected the Conservatives to power.

It does not, like Gibraltar, command the passage from one great ocean to another. But the Black Sea, at whose, gates it stands, is surrounded by the shores of Russia and several other countries, and for Russia it affords the only possible entrance to the Mediterranean. In fact, since the decline of Turkey, Russia is the only power which can make an extended use of the entrance from the Black Sea to the Mediterranean. The chief use or abuse of the fortifications at Constantinople is to prevent Russia from obtaining such an outlet. . . . The Black Sea is also the outlet for the Danube, Europe's great inland waterway, which passes through Germany, Aus-

tria, and several of the Balkan states. If Europe is reconstructed upon any intelligent basis, the Black Sea and its outlet will be made a common highway for the continent.
