OUTLOOK IS ALL DARK TO AUSTRIA

Pessimism Spreading in the Dual Monarchy—All Classes Tired of War.

Rome, March 31—Pessimism is rapidly spreading throughout Austria-Hungary, where since the fall of Premysl even the military authorities no longer hide their astonishment and the people threatened with starvation now wish to see the end of the war.

According to confidential information available here, the conclusion by Austria of a separate peace is no longer considered impossible, since Austria's existence is now dangerously threatened and Germany's help is out of the question.

Austria is now compelled to withdraw troops from Southern Hungary and concentrate every effort against the threatened Russian invasion of Hungary. Thus Transylvania will be exposed to attack by Rumania and Bosnia to attack by Serbia; while Italy may invade the southwestern provinces and send an army against Vienna, which is only 200 miles from the Italian frontier.

FIRE CHIEF NEAR DEATH.

San Jose, Cal., March 31.—Attending physicians have practically given up hope for the recovery of Peter Sanger, fire chief of Butte, Mont., who was operated on here to relieve a fracture of the skull sustained when his automobile collided with a street car while responding to a fire alarm call in Butte several weeks ago. Chief Sanger never rallied from the operation.
