





TURN DOWN REQUEST OF DUKE OF ORLEANS

French Close Doors to Him When he Wants to Serve in the Army.

Paris, March 31 .- The French government has refused the request of the Duke of Orleans that he be granted permission to enlist in the foreign legion under an assumed name, says The Francaise, in an article which deals at length with his efforts to obtain service under the flag of his country.
