## SUPPLY SUFFICIENT FOR ALL THEIR NEEDS

New Westminster, April 16.—The secretary of the Board of Trade is in receipt of a letter from Mr. C. S. Hotchkiss, publicity commissioner, Edmonton, in reply to a communication suggesting that steps be taken with a view to supplying Alberta farmers with labor from British Columbia, thus tending to relieve the unemployment in this province. Mr. Hotchkiss says the impression that there is likely to be a large demand for labor in Alberta over and above the visible supply, for agricultural purposes, such as ploughing and later on harvesting, is unfounded, as owing to depression in other lines, the supply appears to be sufficient for all needs, notwithstanding the fact that more acreage will be sown to wheat this year than ever before.

## BIG OUTLAY REQUIRED.

A well-known machinist speaking today about the possibility of making shrapnel shells in Prince Rupert said that it would mean the installation of additional machinery, costing about \$50,000. The only people, he thinks, who could afford to do it are the drydock. The other machine shops, of course, could turn out parts as well as larger shops. There are several first-class shops in Rupert, including the Ackerberg-Thompson Company, the Rupert Marine Iron Works, Imperial Machine Works, and Leuty's Machine Shop.

An interesting article in the March number of the American Machinist tells of the great accuracy necessary in turning out shells. Everything must be turned out true to the one thousandth part of an inch. At present there are 130 machine shops in Canada turning out shells.
