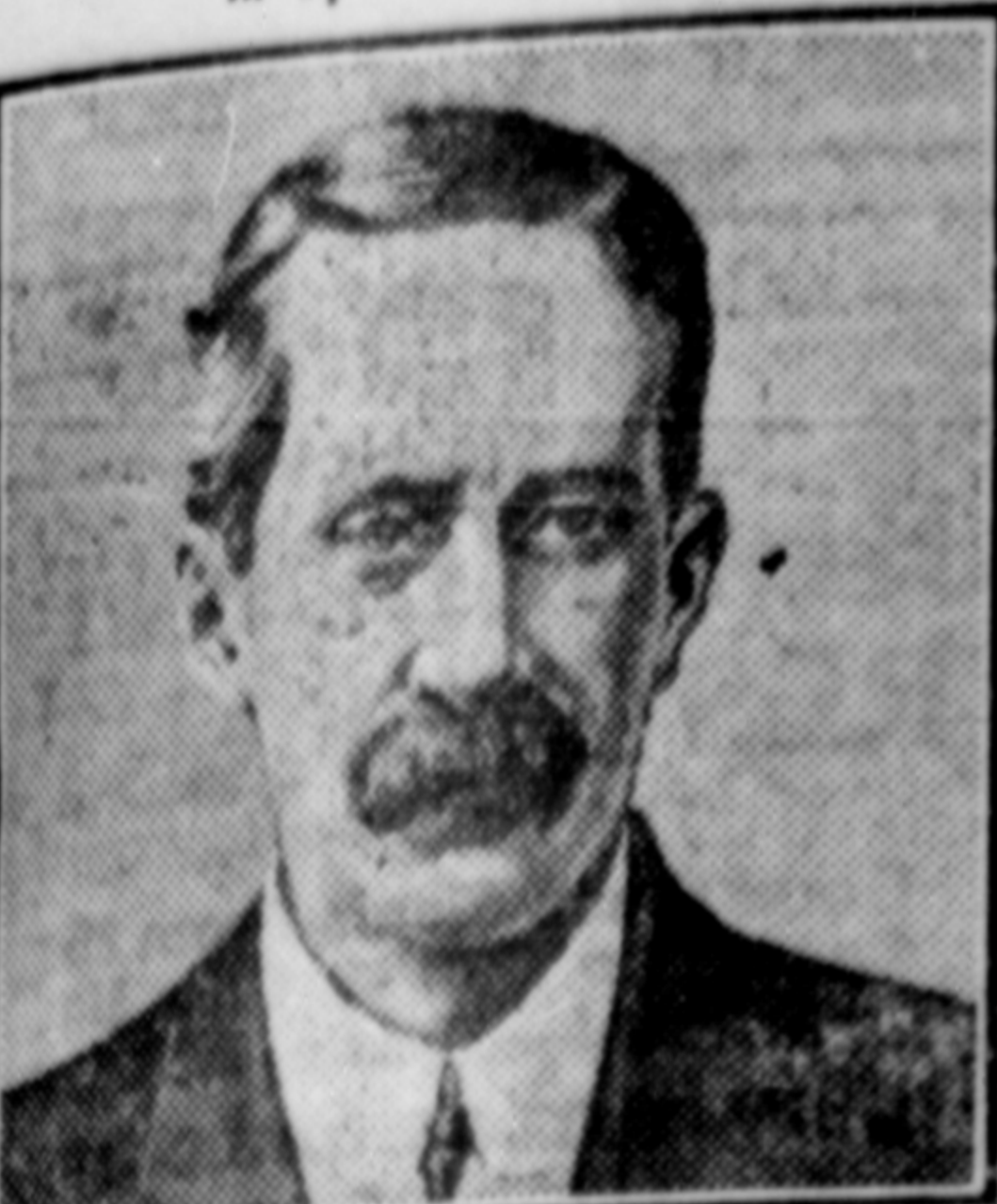

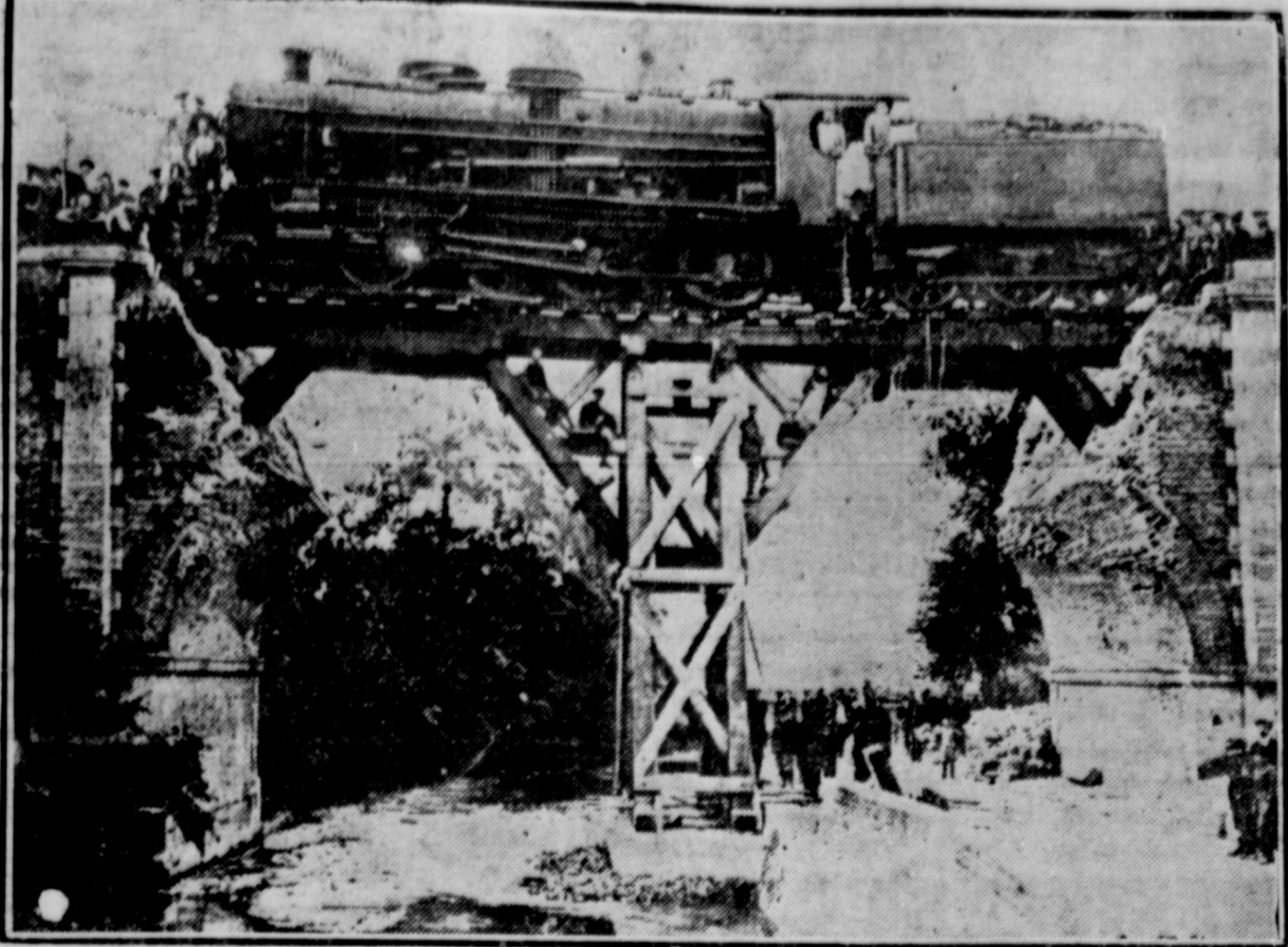

pany was formed with only one  
customer in view, and to give that  
customer its due, the demand has  
always been equal to the Key-  
stone Supply Company.

It was natural, therefore, when  
the war broke out and the Gov-  
ernment was known to have sugar  
in the barrel that the Keystone  
Supply Company should be anx-  
ious to get its hooks in. It might  
have been jam or hay or green  
cheese or anything else, for the  
Keystone Supply Company manu-  
factures nothing. Its business is  
to supply things on commission.  
But in this case it happened to be  
binoculars because the goods  
were easily handled and the  
prices large. But there were diffi-  
culties in the way, the chief of  
them being the Ellis Brothers, of  
Toronto, who had a first skim-  
ming of ten per cent. off the top,  
and who were supposed to have  
twice that much by breaking the  
ring price for binoculars.

The Keystone Supply Company  
had to get past the "Ellis boys,"  
as Major-General Sam calls them,  
before it could load the Militia  
Department with cheap glasses  
at a high figure. To make a long  
story short, the Keystone Supply  
Company did this by flim-flam-  
ming the Ellis brothers and hold-  
ing back the original invoices, so  
that a glass costing \$9.75 to make  
was ultimately sold to the Gov-  
ernment for \$52. As a result of  
this surprising discrepancy be-  
tween prime cost and retail price  
Col. Hurdman has been suspend-  
ed for "lack of judgment," but  
that does not make the case any  
the less interesting.

The Ellis brothers, who were  
paid ten per cent. to shoo the  
other patriots off, should have  
kept closer watch. Perhaps they  
couldn't. Perhaps the pressure  
was too great. At any rate, pa-  
triotism gathered round those bi-  
noculars like flies around a cake.  
How many persons do you sup-  
pose intervened between produc-  
er and consumer in the case of  
the binoculars? Just eight—  
count 'em—eight! Here they are:  
Manufacturer, New York import-  
er; New York broker; Bilsky, an  
Ottawa jeweller; Birkett, who  
bought from Bilsky; Taylor,

whose connection with binoculars  
I don't remember except that,  
like the little piggie-wiggie, he  
wanted his too; an official in the  
Militia Department who had to  
be greased \$2 a glass; the Ellis  
brothers' 10 per cent. right off the  
top; the Government of Canada.

CERTIFICATE OF APPROVAL.

1. WHEREAS the Corporation of the City of Prince Rupert is incorporated under an Act entitled the "City of Prince Rupert Incorporation Act, 1910,"—B. C. Statutes 1910, Chapter 41:
  2. AND, WHEREAS, by Resolution of the Council of the said Corporation authority was given to stake water rights on the North Arm of Wark Channel:
  3. AND, WHEREAS, the said Corporation has applied for a water licence to divert water from Thulme River, a tributary of the said North Arm, for power purpose:
  4. AND, WHEREAS, the said corporation has, after due notice, petitioned for the approval of its undertaking as far as it relates to the said application for a licence:
  5. AND, WHEREAS, no objection has been filed to the said petition:
  6. THIS IS TO CERTIFY that the undertaking of the said corporation in so far as it relates to the said application for a licence is approved, subject to the terms and conditions of the "Water Act, 1914," and to the following additional terms and conditions:
  7. Any licence issued under said application shall, notwithstanding the issue of this certificate, be subject to adjustment by the Board of Investigation:
  8. The said undertaking has been divided into two parts, the first part consisting of the surveys of such of the works proposed in the said application for a licence as the Comptroller of Water Rights shall consider necessary, and the second part consisting of the construction, maintenance, and operation of such works.
  9. The surveys required under the first part shall be commenced on or before the 1st day of June, 1915, and the plans thereof shall be deposited with the Comptroller of Water Rights on or before the 1st day of November, 1917.
  10. The second part of the undertaking shall not be commenced until a bylaw under the provisions of which the said Corporation propose to carry out the undertaking has been duly passed and approved, nor until a further certificate of approval under Section 83 of the "Water Act, 1914," has been issued.
  11. The territory within which the said Corporation shall exercise its powers in respect of the use of the said water is the City of Prince Rupert.
  12. This certificate shall not in any way be deemed to be an approval of the plans of any works covered by the proposed undertaking or to authorize the construction of such works, but shall have the effect only of a certificate issued under the provisions of Section 81 of the "Water Act, 1914," and shall be subject to such provisions, and to the rights of the Continental Power Company under an application filed on the 15th day of August, 1908.
  13. This certificate shall become null and void without any notice unless a further certificate as required by Clause 10 hereof be applied for before the 1st day of June, 1917.
