## NERLICH CASE WILL BE TRAVERSED NOW

Toronto, April 26-The application of Mr. I. F. Hellmuth, counsel for Mr. Emil Nerlich, that the charge of high treason against Mr. Nerlich be held over until the Court of Appeal has given a decision in the reserve case following the conviction for conspiracy, has been received by the Attorney General. Hon. I. B. Lucas stated today that he had considered the point, and had come to the conclusion that the Crown would not press the pending charge until the Court of Appeal has given their decision on the former charge.

"The matter will be allowed to rest entirely in the hands of the judge," stated Mr. Lucas. "If the judge sees fit to let the high treason hearing stand over, this department will not raise any serious objections."

As no date has yet been fixed by the Court of Appeal for the hearing of the stated case, this means that the Nerlich case will doubtless be traversed from the pres- FOR A ent session.
