PRETTY INCIDENT IN PARIS STREET

Paris, April 30.—An incident in Paris yesterday illustrates the popular regard for General Pau, who has been spending some time in this city since returning from his political mission to Petrograd and the Balkan capitals. Persons who saw the general enter the Red Cross branch in Place Madeleine waited in the street to see him come out. A crowd soon collected. A young girl borrowed a hat and quickly collected enough money in the crowd to buy for the general a huge bouquet of red, white and blue flowers.

General Pau appeared to be deeply moved on receiving the flowers and kissed the girl. The crowd cheered him, and as he drove off in his motor car he responded by shouting, "Vive la France!"

PROMINENT VISITORS.

Mr. J. D. McArthur, the prominent railway contractor of the Middle West, and party came through last night on the G. T. P. Mr. McArthur's private car was attached to the regular G. T. P. train. He was accompanied by Mrs. McArthur, Mrs. (Dr.) Wilson and Miss McLeod, of Edmonton. They left this morning for the South by the Prince Rupert. They will visit the San Francisco Fair.

SHELLS CONTRACT.

Mr. Wright, commissioner of the Board of Trade, has just received a letter from W. T. Donnelly, consulting engineer of the drydock, with regard to the contract for shells here. Mr. Wright had written Mr. Donnelly in order to urge his co-operation, which he has promised to give, and extended his thanks for bringing the matter to his attention. Mr. Donnelly stated that he expected to leave for Prince Rupert within a week and would go into the matter further while here.

Mr. Wright has also received a letter from Colonel Carnegie with the assurance that he would give the matter his attention.

SELLING HIS LIFE.

Smithers, April 30.—Word has been received from J. Aldous, who left Smithers and joined the Canadian contingent, to the effect that he has been running a machine gun in the trenches since March 1. That Jack must bear a charmed life goes without saying, for it has been estimated by authorities that the average life of a soldier in the trenches is three weeks. Ending the letter, he says, "I know they'll get me yet, but I'll kill as many of the Germans as I can first."

TO RESTORE BELGIUM.

Pope Said to Have Pledged Himself to Use His Influence.

Rome, April 30.—The Messagero is responsible for the statement that the Pope, after having examined the documents presented to him by Monsignor Duploigne, rector of the University of Louvain and Belgian Deputy Melot, was convinced that the German action in Belgium was deplorable. According to the Messagero, Benedict XV formally pledged himself, no matter what the result of the war, to use his influence to have Belgium restored, and has authorized Monsignor Duploigne to acquaint Cardinal Mercier with his determination.

BRITISH SHIPYARDS GIVE TIME TO WARSHIP WORK

London, April 30.—Shipbuilding yards around the coast of Great Britain are more and more engaged on warship construction and the output of mercantile vessels is thereby decreasing. Last month twelve vessels were launched on the Clyde against last year.

Ten new boats are fitting out in the Glasgow district, among them being the new Leyland liner Bostonian.

The east coast yards are engaged on a number of small coasting trade vessels, while the Irish yards are working overtime mostly on government work.

At the Barrow works of Messrs. Vickers, Limited, an increasing number of girls have been employed in various departments recently. An army of them now pass in and out of the works daily.

MAY 24th CELEBRATION.

Hazelton is planning to have a big celebration on May 24th at the old town. There will be horse races, Indian races, rock drilling and baseball games as well as a dance in the evening. It is to be given under the auspices of the Hazelton Athletic Association.
