

## DESTROYERS ARE LOST--TRAWLER CARRIES GUNS

London, May 3-The Admiralty \* reports that the destroyer Recruit has been sunk by a submarine. Twenty-five of her crew of fiftyeight were saved by the trawler Daisy under gunfire from the submarine. A division of British destroyers destroyed two German torpedo boats which sank the trawler Columbia without hoisting their colors.
