BOARD OF TRADE DON'T WANT ELECTION

Montreal, May 7.—The council of the local Board of Trade has passed a resolution opposing a general election and deprecating the discussion of a possible election "at this unprecedented time of stress" and declaring:

"The political strife inseparable from the holding of a general election might at this time occasion such division of opinion as would seriously interfere with the provisions of assistance that all Canadians are anxious to give toward securing victory for the Empire and its allies, and further, that the business of the country, now showing signs of recovery from a period of depression would receive a serious setback by the holding of a general election."

SASK. CONSERVATIVES' POLICY ON TEMPERANCE

Moose Jaw, April 27.—At the Moose Jaw city Conservative convention this evening, W. B. Willoughby, K. C., the party leader, who was again nominated for the Legislature, set forth the Conservative policy on the liquor question. It provides for the taking of a plebiscite on provincial prohibition at the first municipal election following the next provincial election.

If the referendum be adopted, then the Conservative party pledges itself to introduce total prohibition within one year after the taking of the vote. In the event of the referendum not carrying, the liquor traffic is to be placed under the control of an independent commission. Should total prohibition become law, the municipalities will be given power to erect or purchase such buildings as may be deemed necessary for the accommodation of travelers.

CALGARY WORKINGMEN OPPOSE PROHIBITION

Calgary, May 7.—By an overwhelming vote, the Trades and Labor Council, at their last meeting, decided to fight prohibition in the province.

Twenty-four unions, representing 3,200 workers, supported the Brewery Workers Union in its resolution opposing prohibitory legislation, and pledging the council to work against it, while only two locals, representing between 250 and 300 voters, voted in favor of a "dry" Alberta.

The decision was not altogether unexpected. The division was taken after a debate in which both sides spoke at length and received an attentive hearing. Some of the speeches showed that the subject had been well and deeply studied from all angles.

The following was the resolution originally submitted by the Brewery Workers, which, after going the rounds of the union, received general endorsement:

Will Upset Economic Conditions.
"Whereas, the proposed prohibitory legislation will upset the economic existence of thousands of workers in the province, but will not prevent the drinker from obtaining alcoholic liquor;

"And, whereas, thousands of Alberta voters will be at the seat of war in Europe in July and so be deprived of a voice in the matter;

"And, whereas, the attitude of a large number of the advocates of prohibition is one of opposition to organized labor;

"And, whereas, it has been found in those parts of Canada which are now dry lower wages prevail than in those parts which have licensing laws:

"Be it resolved, that this council goes on record as being opposed to the prohibitory legislation, and pledges itself to work against the same."

What action will now be taken by the council remains to be seen. That it will be followed by action is implied in the wording of the resolution, which pledges the council to work against the proposed legislation.
