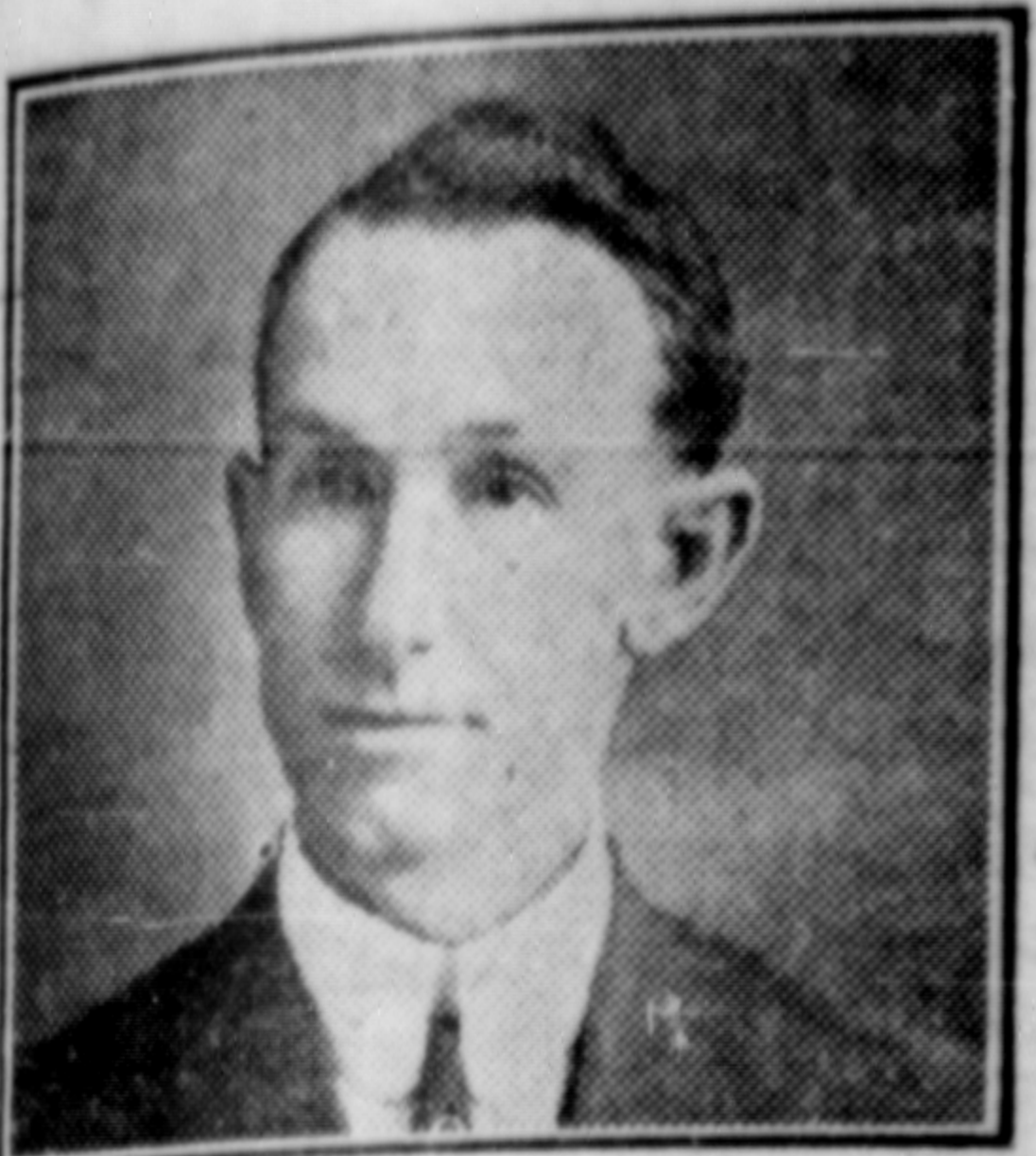

SUGGESTION ON PRODUCE EXCHANGE

Victoria—A somewhat unusual letter, but one which probably opens an avenue for successful interchange of business will be read in council tonight from the city clerk of Prince Rupert.

It states that the city authorities of the northern port are in communication with the municipalities in British Columbia and Alberta, inquiring as to prices and the likelihood of supplying the market with commodities in their localities, and the possibility of supplying in exchange fish at cost price, plus freight.

While the fish used in Victoria is caught in local waters, there are some fruit products around this city which require an avenue for marketing, and the subject will doubtless be taken up by the fruitgrowers' associations and farmers' institutes around Victoria.—Victoria Times.

HEAVY CASUALTIES.

Every third or fourth man of the first Canadian contingent from Vancouver is reported killed or wounded in the casualty lists covering the losses in the fighting in the region of St. Julien, Belgium. The losses among Vancouver officers is very heavy. Of the six clerks of the Royal Bank of Canada in Vancouver who went with the contingent, three have been killed, two are wounded and the sixth is reported missing.

DECLARES BERNSTORFF SHOULD BE EXECUTED

Knew of Huns' Plans to Murder Non-Combatants, Says London Express.

London, May 14.—The Daily Express says editorially:

"Count Von Bernstorff was an accessory before the fact to the murder of American citizens who went to their death when the Lusitania was torpedoed. It is not for us to say what action the United States government should take in the face of this blatant outrage to civilization. It may be that in the face of the rage and indignation which are sure to be aroused from one end of the union to the other, President Wilson still may contrive to remain neutral and still may be content to write protests and demand explanations.

"The United States knows her own business best, but this we may be permitted to say: If the President were to order the arrest of the German ambassador and put him on trial before an American jury for murder, and if Anglo-Saxon justice sent this worthy servant of his blasphemous master to the electric chair, a most splendid blow would be struck for humanity and the world would be spared a repetition of these cold-blooded horrors which are making living a nightmare."

REGINA PASSENGERS SAFE.

Regina, May 14.—All Regina people on board the Lusitania were saved.

Rev. H. L. Dwyer and Mrs. Dwyer, mentioned in the list of survivors, wired from New York. Mrs. E. L. Middlemast cabled her husband from Queenstown that she is safe. Mrs. H. R. Froese, of this city, received a cable from her husband saying he is safe and well.

SEEDING REPORTS.

Regina, May 14.—The Department of Agriculture is in receipt of week-end telegraphic reports from members of the outside staff engaged in various parts of the province. An outstanding feature is that wheat seeding is practically completed. High winds have been prevalent and on light lands some re-seeding may be necessary. A quarter of the oats acreage is seeded and barley seeding has commenced. In the southwestern district it is very evident that no efforts must be spared to conserve moisture.
