### BRITISH SOLDIERS ILL TREATED IN GERMANY

The following is an extract from a letter written by a British soldier held prisoner in Germany.

"We are being starved here. We get rice water and horse beans only; no solid food. One loaf of bread for six days. Several men have been run through with bayonets by the guard, and a large number are being flogged and tied to a barbed wire post for six hours, with their toes just touching the ground. They do this without any just cause. We have one blanket, and all the men are suffering with itch and dysentery. The guards knock us about unmercifully with rifles and sticks. We have hardly anything to wear, as our captors took them away. It is worse than being in Hell. They have given pants, coats and shirts to the French, but will give the British nothing.
