Throughout the whole game the Drydock was the better team and they fully deserved their three-goal lead at half time, although had Smith, at centre for the Callies, accepted two good openings, their lead might not have been so pronounced. In the second period the Callies improved a little, but the forwards never made much impression on the "All Blacks" defence, whereas the Drydock forwards increased their team's lead with another two points, taken by McIlravey and Neilson. The latter part of the game was waged in heavy rain and both teams were glad when the final whistle blew, with the Drydocks winning by five goals to nil. This is the Drydock's initial success against the Callies. Best for the Drydock were McDuff, McCraik, Winchby, McIlravey and McWilliams, while for the Callies' side, Murray, Abbott, Foote and McIntosh were outstanding.
