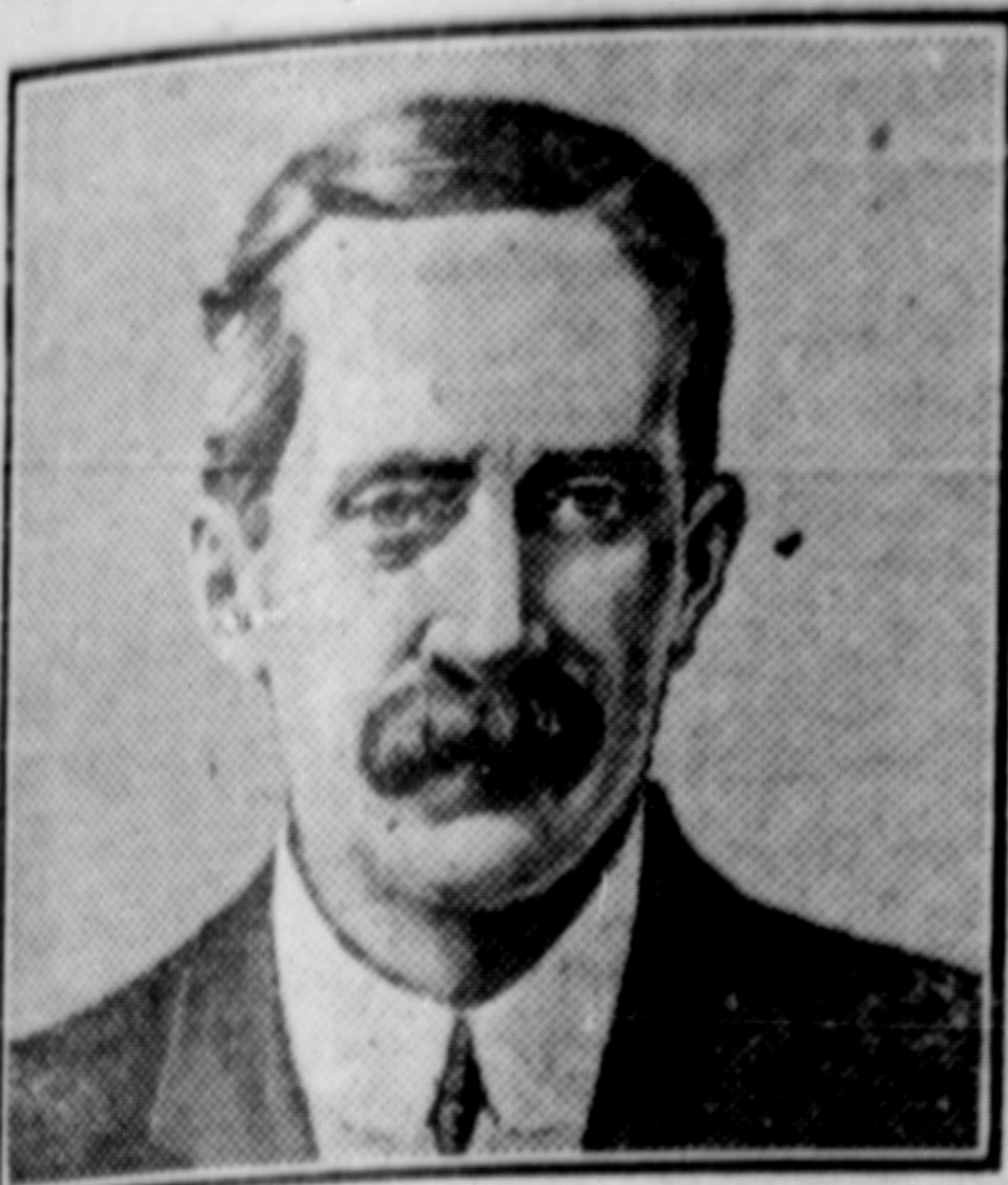

GERMAN-AMERICAN LADY SPEAKS VERY PLAINLY

A letter from Mina Dankwort, a German woman of Brooklyn, New York, published in the New York Sun, has come in for considerable attention. In the course of this letter, the writer remarks:

"The deliberate torpedoing of the Lusitania will, I trust, bring home once and for all to the real American people the plain fact that the royal Prussian military oligarchy dominated and directed by the Hohenzollern, Von Tirpitz, Von Roon, Moltke, Buelow, Besele, Von Der Goltz and what is known as their 'black Prussian' policy have completely set at naught all established usages of civilized warfare. This has dragged into the mire the escutcheons of Saxony, Bavaria, Swabia and Wuerttemberg to the eternal disgust of many American citizens of German descent like myself.

"Some of us wish to express our indignation and abhorrence of this damnable deed, which has been foisted by these Prussian vipers upon the fair name of old Germany. May the ultimate just retribution for these murders be vested where it rightfully belongs, upon the Prussian, the Brandenburger and the Brunswicker. This from a granddaughter of the men of '48."

The brief wire which was received by Mr. Place says: "War Office desires to notify Jas. Place, next of kin Pte. Geo. Place, Canadian Royal Horse Artillery, recommended for the Victoria Cross by general commanding for conspicuous gallantry, saving battery from capture during night attack.
