AUSTRALIA IN GRIP OF TERRIBLE DROUGHT

Australia is in the grip of an appalling drought, with cattle and sheep dying by the thousands, according to Elwood Mead, former chairman of the River and Harbor Commission of Australia, who arrived in San Francisco last week. Mead places the number of sheep that will perish at 180,000,000, and says that cattle are going by the thousands. Hay is selling as high as \$60 a ton, bringing the price of horses down to \$1.50 to \$3 per head. The worst effects of the drought are being felt in Queensland, Victoria, New South Wales and South Australia.—Ex.
