CONFEDERATE VETERANS PLEDGE WILSON LOYALTY

Richmond, Va., June 9.—Thousands of Confederate veterans at the opening of their twenty-fifth reunion here on Tuesday cheered the hope expressed by their leaders that peace in America may not be disturbed by war in Europe. They reiterated their loyalty to the Union, shouted pledges of support to the President in any crisis and bowed assent to prayers that those who guide the Republic's destinies might be blessed with wisdom to deal with pending international affairs.

Frequent references to the European war were made at the convention of the United Sons of Confederate Veterans, who cheered a pledge of support to the President in upholding the nation's honor. Tributes were expressed to Jefferson Davis, Robt. E. Lee, Stonewall Jackson and other Confederate leaders, among them Gen. E. J. B. Stuart, whose widow appeared on the platform and received an ovation.

The Southern posts were welcomed to Richmond by Governor Stuart and Judge D. G. Tyler, who spoke in behalf of Virginia veterans. Judge Tyler, a son of President Tyler, compared the Confederacy to Belgium.

"If ever the dream of universal peace shall be realized," he said, "it will be due to the acceptance by the nations of the principles for which the Confederate soldier died, the cause for which Washington threw off his allegiance to Great Britain and that for which gallant Belgium is being immolated."

GREAT MILITARY SHOW AT WESTHOLME THEATRE

The Westholme management announces for tonight and tomorrow night a program of exceptional quality. The magnificent five-reel feature entitled "The British Army" was shown by royal command before their Majesties the King and Queen. This is the only film taken by the authority of the Army Council. The picture commences with the raw recruit entering the service, bringing him out after months of hard training as one of the finest of soldiers. It also shows Tommy Atkins in play hours. The mechanism of the different guns is very explicitly shown, from the quick-firing Maxims to the heavy guns which fire a shell weighing 100 pounds. The picture will give the public a splendid idea of the difference between the army in times of peace and the army in time of war. There is also depicted some splendid scout work; also the effective work done by the aeroplane. There are 250,000 men and 10,000 cavalrymen taking part in this five-reel picture, presenting to the public a complete story of mobilization and showing service under war conditions. This picture should pack The Westholme, as it will only be shown today and tomorrow. The orchestra, under the direction of Vincent C. Knowles, will play a specially arranged program.

In addition to "The British Army" picture, will be shown a very laughable comedy entitled "The Girl at the Lunch Counter."
