THE CITY MARKET.

The City Council has decided to engage a salaried manager for the City Market. On a purely commission basis, the market has not been a success. and it is certain that, under the new arrangement, the Council will be better able to control matters. The change will also throw an added responsibility upon the city, as it will be directly responsible for anything done by its salaried official. The Council also proposes to sell the products of Alberta, Saskatchewan and British Columbia free of all commission, and no charge will be made to producers or their representatives, who are duly approved by the Market Committee, who sell their produce in the market.

Merchants pay a license fee every six months for the privilege of doing business in the city, and it seems illogical that business men, who already have very heavy running expenses, should have to reckon! with such fees, while the city is immune. Tax-paying merchants will also have to pay their share of the salary of the market manager; therefore, they will be paying so much! per annum in order to keep a competitor in the field.

This is a comparatively small matter, but it seems unfair that the consumer who buys from the shopkeeper should have to pay the trading expenses of the consumer who buys from the City Market. The consumer must always pay the cost of doing business; therefore, it seems only reasonable that the cost of doing business | at the City Market should be included in the price of the goods sold in the market.

Let us have a City Market by all means, but let it be conducted along businesslike lines. Make the market a self-supporting institution, carrying its own burden of expenses, without taking one cent out of general fund. The market will be




