COPPER AND LEAD AT RECORD PRICES

New York, June 14—High grade or lake copper sold at 20 1/8 cents per pound in the local market Saturday, a record price since 1907, when for a brief period it sold at 25 3/4 cents.

Lead also advanced to 6 1/2 cents, its best price, according to reports, in about thirty years. In the Boston market, lead was quoted at 7 cents.

The advance in the metals results chiefly from the enormous demand by the European countries now at war, especially England and Russia.

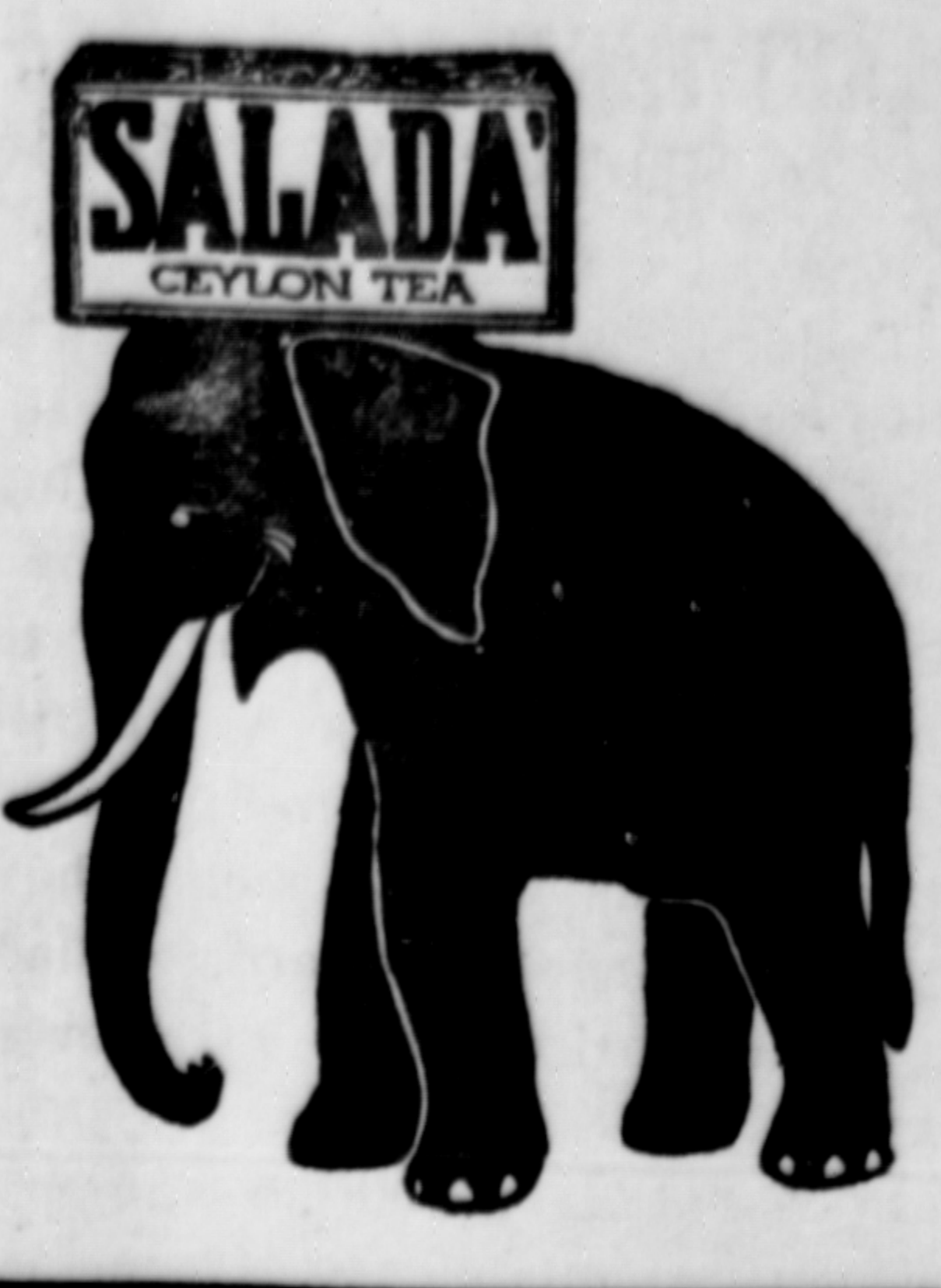
TEA IN THE TRENCHES.

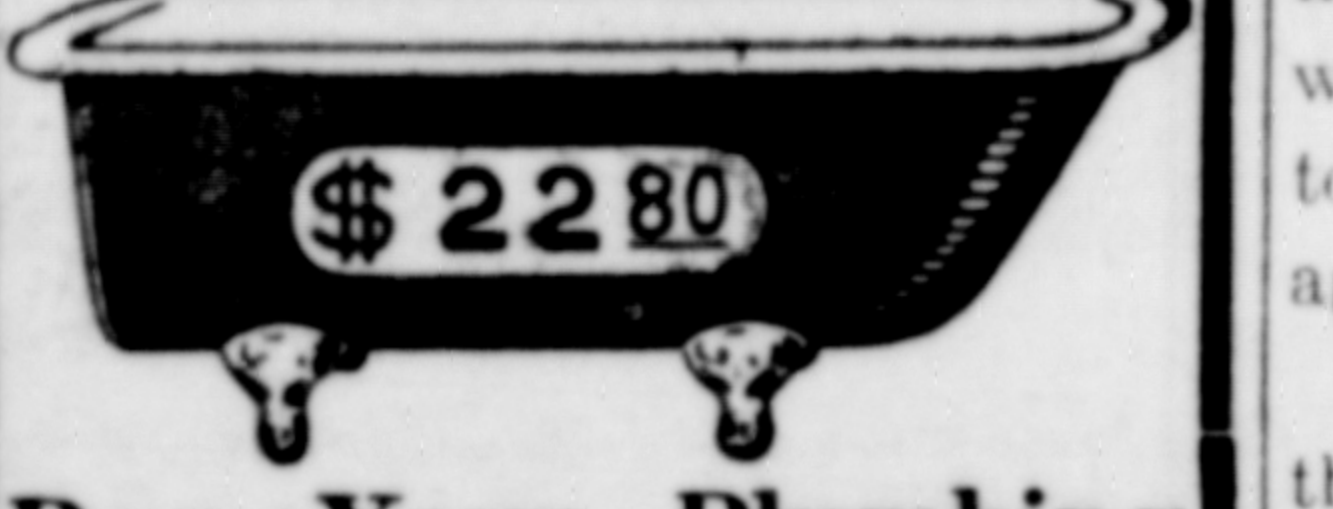
