## REGIMENT WINS IN CITY CUP COMPETITION

In the first round of the City Cup competition last night the Sons of England had to submit to defeat from the Regiment, before the largest gathering of spectators seen this year at a football game. The boys in khaki in this, as in their previous game with the Callies, had no grievance against fortune, in that in both games they played against ten men practically all through, and in both games the right half was the opposing player who crooked, and in both they won by the odd goal. Playing down hill the Sons' forwards were early prominent. Sid Hardy placing nicely in goal for Fred to head high over. Then followed some give and take play in which the soldiers showed their customary dash, but were inclined to be fluky in their kicking. The Sons' forwards showed vastly improved play on their last appearance, and a raid was only spoiled by a back fouling Hardy, within the penalty area. Garnett made no mistake in putting his team one up. Nettled by the reverse, the soldiers forced play to the other end. After some good combined play Benwick forced a corner off kelsey and the resultant kick was a beauty, which Brand did well to clear. Keeping up the pressure, Long scored from a rally in the goal mouth and soon after the Regiment should have assumed the lead from a perfectly placed corner, which crossed the goal untouched.

Play was exceedingly well divided, corners being obtained turn about, and a good shot by Slocomb, saved well by Youngman, was duplicated in an equally good drive by Long at the other end. Half time arrived with the score one all. The second half continued full of interest, though the soldiers' left wing was frequently put out of action by the one back play of the Englishmen. Youngman put over a good drive by Sid Hardy, and Brand did well to stop a long, low shot from the opposing centre half. Fred Hardy got laid out and while the Sons were playing with nine men Long scored from a long drive which the goalkeeper fumbled over the line. Both goals had narrow escapes, when the soldiers' inside left missed an easy one and a determined rally on the khaki stronghold was rather luckily cleared. The game ended in a score of 2 to 1 for the Regiment, although the Sons deserve credit for their plucky play.

### BYLAW NUMBER 249.

A BYLAW TO SHORTEN THE HOURS FOR CARRYING ON THE BUSINESS OF BARBERS' SHOPS IN THE CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT.

WHEREAS a petition has been presented to the Municipal Council of the City of Prince Rupert, asking that this bylaw be passed:

AND WHEREAS it has been proved to the satisfaction of the City Council that the said petition is signed by not less than three-fourths in number of the occupiers of barbers' shops in the Municipality:

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This bylaw shall be known as the "Barbers' Early Closing Bylaw."

2. After the coming into force of this bylaw all barbers' shops in the City of Prince Rupert shall be kept open during the following hours, and no longer, namely:

On ordinary week days, namely, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday 8 a. m. to 7 p. m. On Saturdays from 8 a. m. to 10:30 p. m.

On all days preceding public holidays, the same hours as on Saturday.

On holidays they shall be closed all day, except on those holidays which fall on Monday, upon which holidays they are to keep open from 8 a. m. to 1 p. m.

On holidays which fall on Saturday they shall keep open all day from 8 a. m. to 10:30 p. m.

3. Any person breaking this bylaw by keeping his barber shop open after the hours allowed by this bylaw shall be liable to a fine of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each day, and in default in payment of such fine to imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30) days.

4. This bylaw shall come into force on the first day of July, A. D. 1915, and before that date the bylaw shall be published by inserting the same in one newspaper published in the City of Prince Rupert for one day.

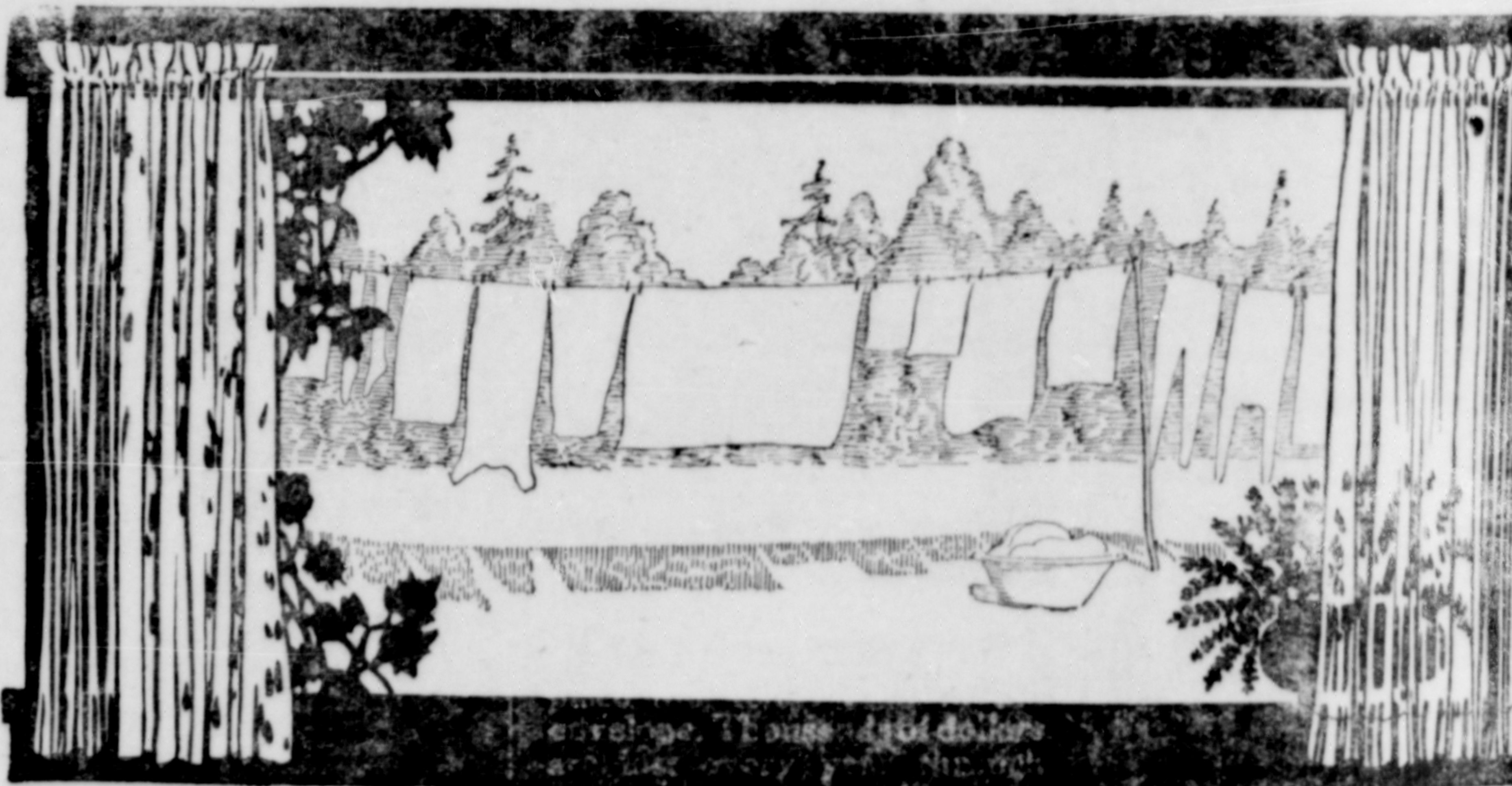
