Evidence of the use of hypnotic suggestion as a cure for nervous disorders was given in an action which a doctor brought before Mr. Justice A. T. Lawrence. The plaintiff was Dr. John Francis Woods, F.R.C.S., of Harley Street, London, W., and he sued Mrs Julitta Ladborough, of Onslow Square, S.W., for £75, 12s, fees for medical attendance. Dr. Woods said that he treated Mrs. Ladborough for neurasthenia and for a rash on her face which was due to her nervous condition.
