HYPNOTISM FOR NERVOUSNESS

Curious Case in England of Doctor Suing Patient For Hypnotic Treatment

Evidence of the use of hypnotic suggestion as a cure for nervous disorders was given in an action which a doctor brought before Mr. Justice A. T. Lawrence. The plaintiff was Dr. John Francis Woods, F.R.C.S., of Harley Street, London, W., and he sued Mrs. Juitta Ladbrough, of Onslow Square, S.W., for £75, 12s. fees for medical attendance. Dr. Woods said that he treated Mrs. Ladbrough for neurasthenia and for a rash on her face which was due to her nervous condition. The defendant pleaded that before the attendances for which the plaintiff claimed payment the hypnotic treatment had proved to be useless, and that the plaintiff offered to give further treatment free of charge.

The plaintiff, in the witness-box, said that he had had 28 years experience. By his treatment, which was known as psycho-therapy, he had cured patients of bad temper, stage fright, delusions, loss of memory, writer's cramp, sea-sickness, deafness, kleptomania and the opium habit. The treatment produced the first stage of hypnotism—the stage of lethargy. The process could be carried out even in the case of unwilling patients. Lieutenant-Colonel Frank Romer, R.A.M.C., Dr. Arthur Latham, Dr. H. R. D. Spitta and Dr. Septimus Sunderland gave evidence of the efficacy of the plaintiff's treatment. Dr. Latham said that he had sent patients to the plaintiff for treatment by psycho-therapy, and he had known of many cases in which the patients had been cured through other doctors had failed.

The defence was that the plaintiff agreed to treat the patient free of charge upon his being paid for previous attendances; that the treatment did no good; and that as the plaintiff had agreed "to meet" the defendant in the matter of fees he was not entitled to the full amount claimed. The defendant called Dr. Leonard Cutler, who had attended her for 10 years. He said that he did not think that the plaintiff's treatment did any good. The defendant in evidence said that she still suffered from the rash at intervals. The Judge eventually gave judgment for the plaintiff for £52, 10s. and costs.
