RAILROADERS SCORED WIN

Got the One Score of Keenly-Contested and Interesting Match With Callies Last Night.

In the football game last evening between the Callies and Grand Trunks—the latter won by the score of 4 to 0. It was the first league match in the second half of the season's schedule and the large crowd which filled the grand stand evinced the interest which is now being taken in football. Last night's two teams have played to a draw in two other games during the season and neither of them up to last evening had been beaten. It looked for a while last night that it might be a no-score game as it was not until almost the end of the second half that the railwaymen put in the lone goal.

The first half was more or less a punting match between the defenders of both sides, but some good rushes were made at Goathies Martin and Waldorf. Both teams seemed to be nervous and waiting for the break. The kicking was erratic with no one settling down to the task of scoring. Just before half time the G. T. P. boys with the advantage of the down grade were pressing very hard and left half O'Donnell got greatly excited at the throw-ins. At the whistle the two teams readily took to the side lines with no scores tallied up to that time.

At the resumption of play there was the same feeling as at first but the Callies had steadied down with the satisfaction that they had held their own on the up hill.

An unfortunate kick disabled Fanthorpe of the G. T. P. forward line and he had to retire a few minutes. They continued with the same keen spirit and finally after a hard rush the ball was slipped by the Callies' backs and Harding took the leather past Bill Martin. This effort proved decisive for the Callies were unable to score in spite of their bombarding tactics of the last few minutes. When Jock Stewart centred the ball from the corner it looked as though Bill Murray would make it good but the ball grazed over the top. At the closing whistle the Scotsmen were still making great efforts to get through.
