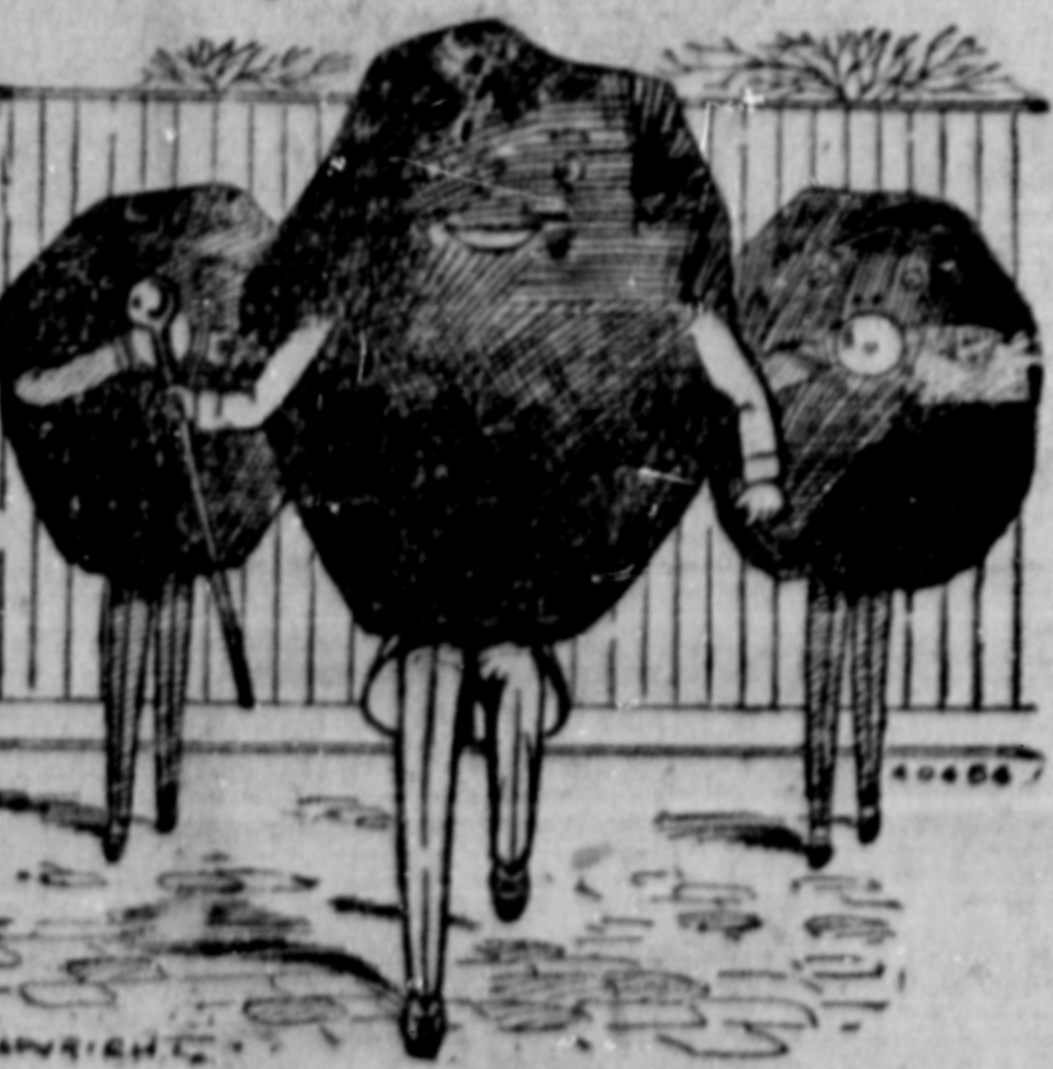

FIND NATIVE COPPER

THE P.A.S., July 6.—Native copper has been struck at Fin Flou in the course of sinking a shaft on the big sulphide ore body. A Crystalline formation of copper in the leaf were taken out in addition to great quantities of small chunks. Indications are that as the shaft goes further down there is some hope that a solid body may be struck.

Synopsis of Land Act Amendments

Minimum price of first-class land reduced to \$5 an acre; second-class to \$10 an acre.
Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.
Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land.
Records of pre-emption abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.
Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres, before receiving certificate.
Where pre-emptor in occupation not less than 3 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because of ill-health, or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.
Records will no longer be made. Residence may be located, provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$100 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture of claim.
Pre-emptor holding Crown grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.
Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.
For grazing and industrial purposes areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company.
Mills, factory or industrial sites on timber land not exceeding 40 acres may be purchased, conditions include payment of stumpage.
Natural hay meadows inaccessible by existing roads may be purchased conditional upon construction of a road to them. Half of one-half of cost of road, not exceeding half of purchase price, is made.
PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.
The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The benefit of which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from four years from the death of such person, to twenty years after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.
No fees relating to pre-emptions are due or payable by soldiers on pre-emptions recorded after June 26, 1918. Taxes are remitted for five years.
Provision for return of moneys accrued, due and been paid since August 4, 1914, on account of payments, fees or taxes on soldiers' pre-emptions.
Interest on agreements to purchase town or city lots held by members of Allied Forces, or dependents, acquired direct or indirect, remitted from enlistment to March 31, 1920.
SUB-PURCHASERS OF CROWN LANDS.
Provision made for issuance of Crown grants to sub-purchasers of Crown lands, acquiring rights from purchasers who failed to complete purchase, involving forfeiture, on fulfilment of conditions of purchase, interest and taxes. Where sub-purchasers do not claim whole of original parcel, purchase price due and taxes may be distributed proportionately over whole area. Applications must be made by May 1, 1920.
GRAZING.
Grazing Act, 1919, for systematic development of livestock industry provides for grazing districts and range administration under Commissioner. Annual grazing permits issued based on numbers ranged; priority for established owners. Stock-owners may form Associations for range management. Free, or partially free, permits for settlers, campers or travellers, up to ten head.

NOTICE TO REAL ESTATE AGENTS AND SALESMEN.

Under the provisions of the Real Estate Agents' Licensing Act, 1920, which becomes effective July 2nd, 1920, every Real Estate Agent and Salesman operating within the Province shall take out a licence.
Section 4 of said Act provides that no person shall act, or offer, or undertake to act as a Real Estate Agent or Salesman in this Province without first having applied for and obtained a licence.
Penalty for non-compliance with provisions of this Act is a fine of not less than fifty dollars and not more than five hundred dollars.
Application for licences must be made to Government Agents or Collectors throughout the Province.

Sealed tenders will be received by the Minister of Lands not later than noon on the 22nd day of July, 1920, for the purchase of Licence X 2438, to cut 6,914,300 feet of spruce, cedar, balsam and hemlock on an area situated on Deer and Bear lakes, Princess Royal Island, Range 4, Coast District.
Three (3) years will be allowed for removal of timber.
