## BIG YEAR FOR SALMON CATCH

J. T. C. Williams Returns With Growing Report After Trip of Inspection.

J. T. C. Williams, inspector of fisheries, returned to town yesterday morning from a visit of inspection to the southern portion of his district bringing with him great reports as to salmon fishing at all points visited.

The run of sockeye on Smiths Inlet, he says, is exceedingly good, salmon gill-net fishermen averaging 65 to the boat, prospects are excellent and climatic conditions are all that could be desired. The canners have packed greatly in excess of last year, about 130 boats operating.

The same remarks apply to Rivers Inlet, the average is about 35 to the boat, and about 180 boats operating. The sockeye run about 10 to the case, which shows how large the sockeye are. This is an excellent indication for a good run.

The same conditions also apply to Namu and Bella Bella, where the salmon gill-net fishermen are averaging about 45 to the boat. The purse and drag seines are doing very little, salmon are late arriving at the creeks, and on arrival proceed up to the spawning grounds.

The run of spring salmon at Bella Coola was most encouraging and gill-net fishermen have done exceedingly well financially. The run of sockeye at the Lowe Inlet creeks has been light and the drag and purse seines have not made any good catches. The run is late and until the last two or three days the climatic conditions have been unfavorable, but now reports of the run are improving.

On the Skeena River the run this year is reported as being better than has been the case for the last five years. On July 6, the run averaged 50 fish per boat, July 7, 65 per boat and on July 8, 40 per boat. Prospects continue to be good. The average pack of sockeye for each canner so far this year is 1,400 cases, which is better than last year, itself an exceptionally good year.

The above conditions are most encouraging and gratifying to all those interested in the salmon fisheries of this district, as it proves that careful protection and conservation and the enforcement of the fisheries regulations, with an efficient staff of officers, will preserve the industry for future generations.
