WATER NOTICE

(USE AND STORAGE). TAKE NOTICE that Taylor Mining Company Limited, whose address is 607 Credit Building, Vancouver, B. C., will apply for a license to take and use 50 cubic feet per second and to store 2,500 acre feet of water, out of the Alice Arm, a tributary of the Kizhauit River, which flows westerly and drains into the Kizhauit River about 25 miles from Alice Arm, in the Province of British Columbia.

The storage dam will be located at the outlet of Clearwater Lake. The capacity of the reservoir to be created is about 2,500 acre feet, and it will flood about 200 acres of land. The water will be diverted from the stream at a point about the outlet of Clearwater Lake, the exact position of which will be determined after survey, and will be used for power purposes upon the territory described as an area of 50 miles radius from the Wolf Group of Mineral Claims near the Kizhauit River.
