FARMERS' EXCURSION HERE TUESDAY NIGHT

Visitors from North Dakota to Reach Here by Special Train Tomorrow Night.

Tomorrow evening at 9 o'clock there will arrive in the city by special train a party of 200 North Dakota farmers who have been two weeks on the way from Winnipeg looking over the western country. Before their arrival here the train will stop at Sunnyside Cannery for an hour, where the visitors will be shown the intricacies of the canning business. A civic committee headed by the mayor will meet them here and give them a welcome to the city. No formal entertainment has been arranged for the evening.

On Wednesday morning the party will be taken to the dry dock and cold storage plant and the Prince Rupert sawmill. They will take the Prince Rupert for Anxoy on Wednesday and after visiting the smelter and other points of interest they will proceed to Vancouver Thursday night.
