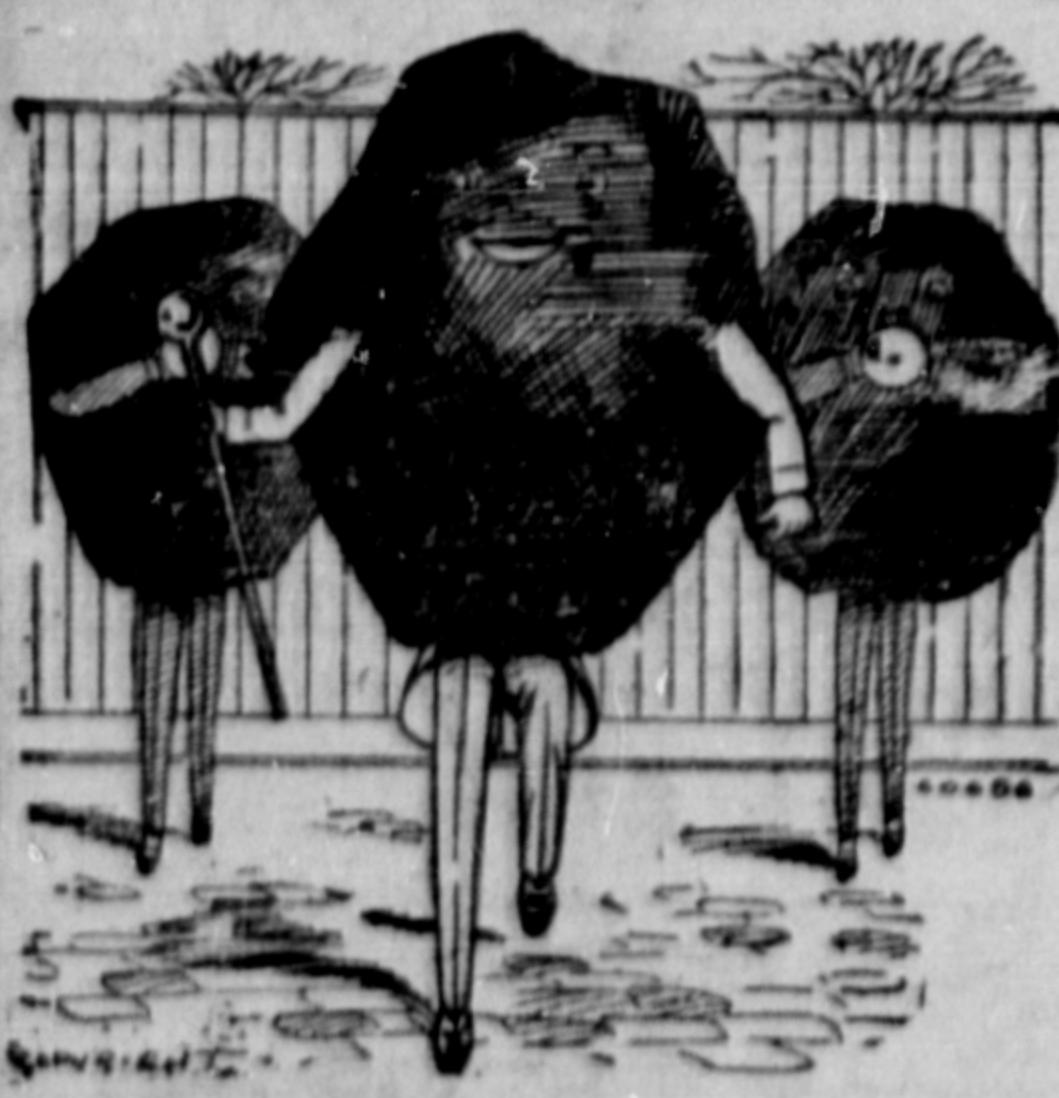

He denounces in strong terms the practice of giving baby a "comforter" as a pacifier, and declares that the manufacture of comforters should be prohibited by law.
