BOTTLED HEADACHES BY THE MILLION TO BE PLACED ON SALE

PARIS, July 16.—Eight million bottles of champagne will be among the items on the lists of commodities to be placed on sale January 28, when the sequestered property of Baron Walter De Munin will be auctioned off. This property was seized in 1915, subsequent to the baron's resumption of German citizenship, when the war began. The number of bottles in the baron's cellars in the vicinity of Rheims, where the sale will take place, was greatly diminished during the war. When General Ludendorff was making his furious drives toward Rheims, and Epernay, the wine cellars were used as shelters for the troops, and the men were given almost priceless wine with their meals.
