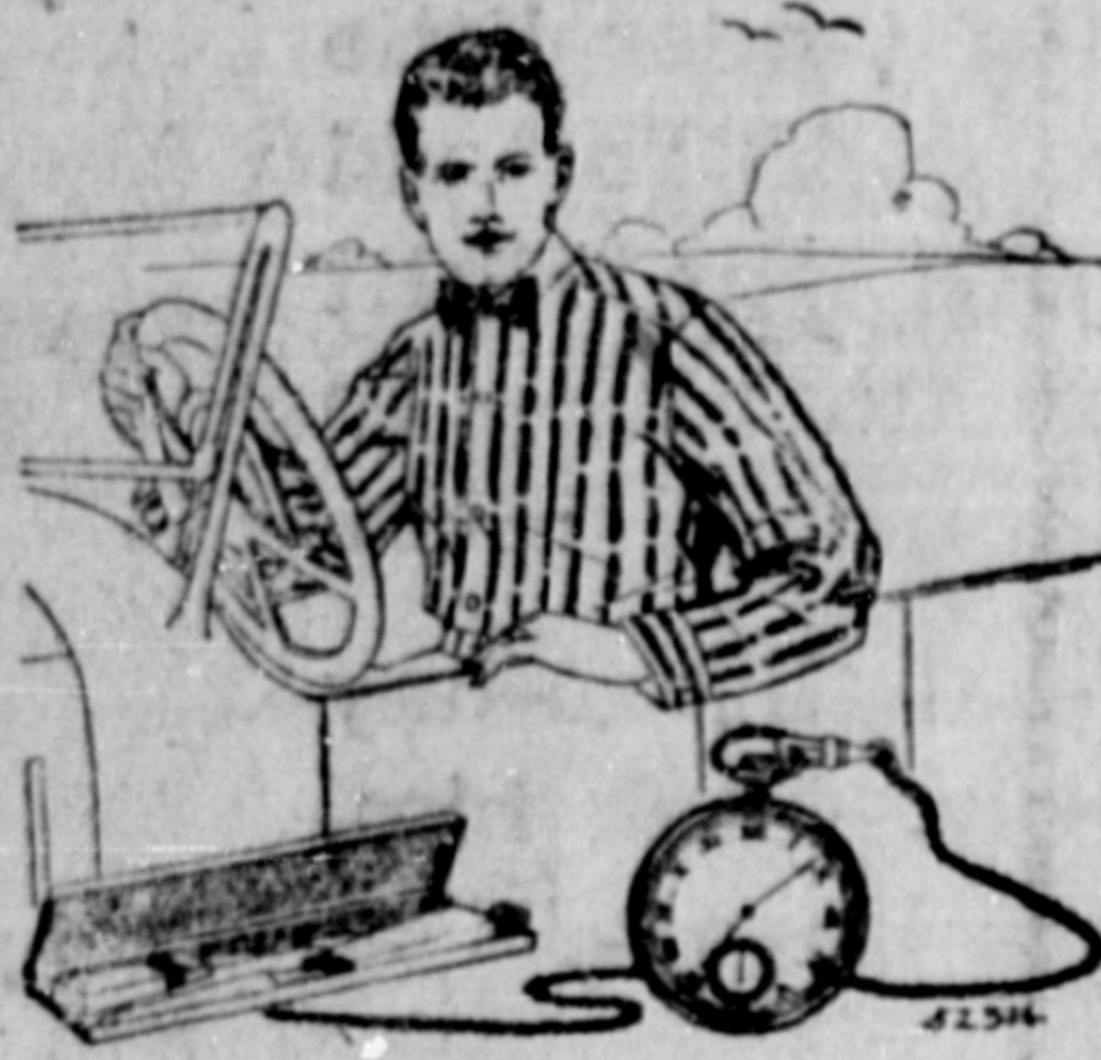

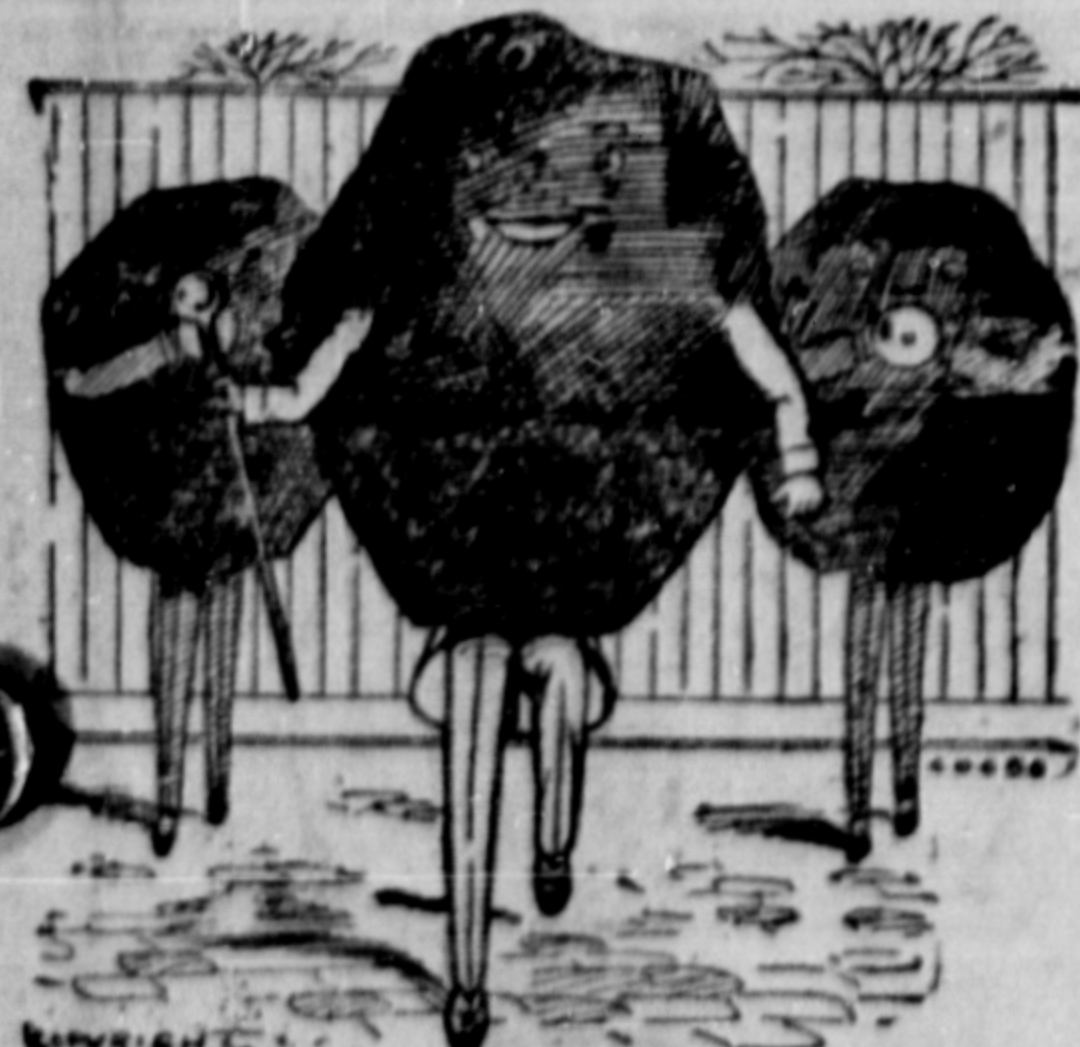

BARBERS STRIKE IN CITY OF MONTREAL

Two Hundred Walk Out, but 600 Stay, so Situation is not so Alarming

MONTREAL, July 16.—Two hundred barbers of the local union are out on strike following refusal of their demands. It was stated at a meeting of the Barbers' Association that it would be impossible to meet the men's demand of \$25 a week wages and half of the receipts of each man over \$35 a week, under the present scale of charges to the customer. Six hundred barbers are still at work, so the strike is not liable to cause much inconvenience.

CANADIAN NATIONAL OFFICE MOVES INTO GRAND TRUNK PLACE

Arrangements have been made in Vancouver for the transfer of the Canadian National offices to the same quarters used by the Grand Trunk Pacific on Granville Street. The Hastings Street Canadian National office is to be abolished, part of the staff going to the Grand Trunk office and the remainder to the Main Street terminal.

This change has been made in pursuance of the policy of combining the work of the two roads in the interests of economy. Considerable extensions are to be made at the Grand Trunk offices.

COKING OVENS ARE SUCCESSFUL VENTURE

H. S. Munroe, New General Manager of Granby Co., is Pleased With Results.

VANCOUVER, July 16.—The establishment of coking ovens at Cassidy, on Vancouver Island, by the Granby Consolidated Mining & Smelting Company is proving a successful venture, according to reports of H. S. Munroe, the new general manager of the company. From 420 tons of coal per day, 300 tons of metallurgical coke are being produced, while the by-products recovered include 5,000 gallons of coal tar, 800 tons of motor fuel, and considerable quantities of ammonium sulphate. The coal tar is used in Vancouver in the manufacture of creosote, and the sulphate for making fertilizer. These results are considered highly satisfactory.
