WATER NOTICE (USE AND STORAGE)

TAKE NOTICE that Taylor Mining Company Limited, whose address is 607 Credit Foncier Building, Vancouver, B. C., will apply for a license to take and use 2500 cubic feet of water out of Clearwater Creek, a tributary of the Kitault River, which flows westerly and drains into the Kitault River about 23 miles north of Alice Arm, in the Province of British Columbia.

The storage-dam will be located at the outlet of Clearwater Lake. The capacity of the dam to be created is about 2,500 acre feet, and it will flood about 200 acres of land.
