



## Football Dates Arranged at Meeting Last Night.

At last night's meeting of the league committee of the Prince Rupert Football Association the draw was held for the Gilhuly cup series. The dates with the referees and linesmen are as follows:

August 11—Callies vs. Sons of England. Referee, S. Thompson. Linesmen, Craggs and Warrior.

August 14—G. T. P. vs. Trail. Referee, McCulloch. Linesmen, Tabrum and Clapperton.

August 20—Cup tie final. Referee, McCulloch. Linesmen, Referees Russell and Thompson.
