

Reports of earnings by the Grand Trunk Railway of Canada, as issued by the London office, show that, while expenses exceeded earnings during January and February, there has been a small balance of net earnings during March, April and May. On the whole, for the five months, expenses exceeded gross receipts by £87,400, and the decrease in net earnings for the five months, as compared with the previous year, stands at £342,000.

As the British railways are losing £1,000,000 a week and the U.S. railways are still in financial difficulty, the Grand Trunk has plenty of company.
